34 Queen Candidates

Second and third place girls will automatically be named princesses.

All money raised will be used by the Lions Club to promote the Festival. Festival proceeds will be used for charity work within this area.

The Queen and her royal party will travel throughout the Panhandle to advertise the Festival and will reign over the Festival here in Hedley. The Queen will be officially crowned at the Coronation proceedings at the Queens Ball the last night of the Festival.

Under sponsorship of the Hedley Lions Club, and with cooperation of every other organization, the churches, school, and merchants the First Annual Cotton Festival will be held in Hedley Friday and Saturday, October 31 and November 1.

The Festival, first of its kind in this entire area will be the biggest project ever attempted by the Lions Club, and Lion President Carl Morris urgently requested full support and cooperation from each and every citizen.

A full fledged commercial carnival is being imported, local organizations will be given concession booths, industrial and agricultural exhibits are being arranged, a grand parade scheduled, and a Queen and two princesses will be elected to reign over the Queen's Ball to climax the Festival.

Publicity will be spread over all of Texas, Oklahoma, New Mexico and Colorado in an effort to build the festival into The Big Event every year from now on.

Bob Harris was elected General Chairman at the Festival organization meeting held last week. Festival offices will be opened in Scout headquarters, upstairs of the Theatre building.

In addition to the big Festival itself, Hedley will play host at the same time to the first annual Texas Explorer Scout Bivouac and Jamboree with some five hundred Explorers being invited.

All in all, Lions and Festival officials hope to make it bigger and better than any surrounding events of similar nature have ever been. Designed to offer the merchants an opportunity to increase their revenues as well as build up a charity fund for the Lions Club, a percentage of all Festival income will revert to the sponsoring organization.

Mayor M. L. Thornberry is expected to issue a proclamation setting October 31 and November 1 aside as City Holidays to celebrate the event. Lions urged however, that business men keep their store open to serve the visitors and gain the financial benefits.

 For Merchants**

General Chairman Bob Harsis of the 1952 First Annual Hedley Cotton Festival, told committee-men of the tremendous opportunities offered the local merchants through the festival.

Publicity is being designed to create an appeal and interest that will draw literally thousands to Hedley for the two day celebration scheduled Oct. 31 and Nov. 1.

One of the big complaints of events in other towns is that visitors find the majority of the local merchants closed during the celebration. Harris urged all Hedley retailers to plan to remain open, even longer hours than usual to take advantage of the visitors trade dollars. A special committee headed by Leon Reeves has been set up within the Festival organization to help merchants plan their activities during the two day

holiday.

State permission is being sought to block Main Street off for Festival events, therefore all visitors will be on foot, offering a better chance for walk in trade. Reeves and his committee will stress the importance of attractive window displays, exterior advertising, and friendly personalized service to the visitors as well as local customers during the festival days.

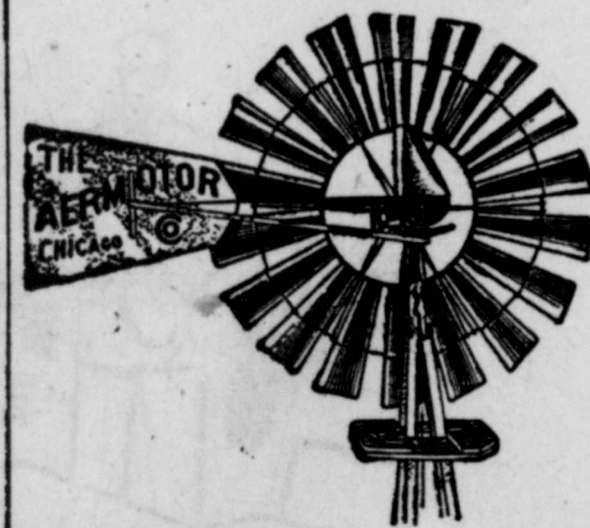
