## Wanda Hansard Elected Cotton Festival Queen

With votes at a penny apiece, 61,822 ballots were counted by a special Festival committee Monday night at the Security State Bank. The title of Queen was given to Wanda Ann Hansard with her sponsor the West Texas Gin raising 10,346 votes for her. The two princesses elected were Charlene Johnson with 6309 votes from the City Grocery and Joyce Sanders with 5364 votes from the C. L. Johnson Insurance agency. There were many runners up in the extremely successful campaign according to Contest Chairman Leon Reeves. A total of \$618.22 was turned into the Lions Club Activity fund, a portion of which will be used to promote the forthcoming Festival and the balance to join Festival earnings for local charity work.

All candidates were named honorary princesses in their own right and will make the big Booster Tour of the Panhandle next week, and will be honored at the Coronation ceremony to be held in the High School Auditorium.

The Royal Party consisting of Queen Wanda, Princess Charlene and Princess Joyce made their first public appearances Tuesday when they were luncheon guests at the Clarendon Lions Club followed by an auditorium appearance at the Clarendon Junior College. Honorary Princess Letha Moss accompanied the royal party and provided musical accompaniment to the Queen and Princesses, who sang for the students.

The Royalty will travel to Pampa Monday for participation in its 50th anniversary celebration.

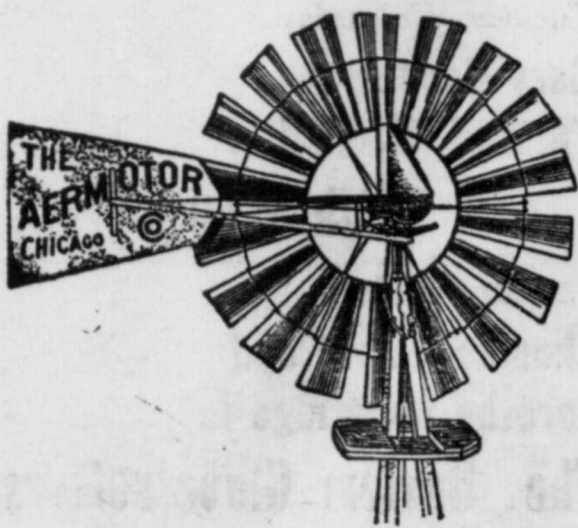

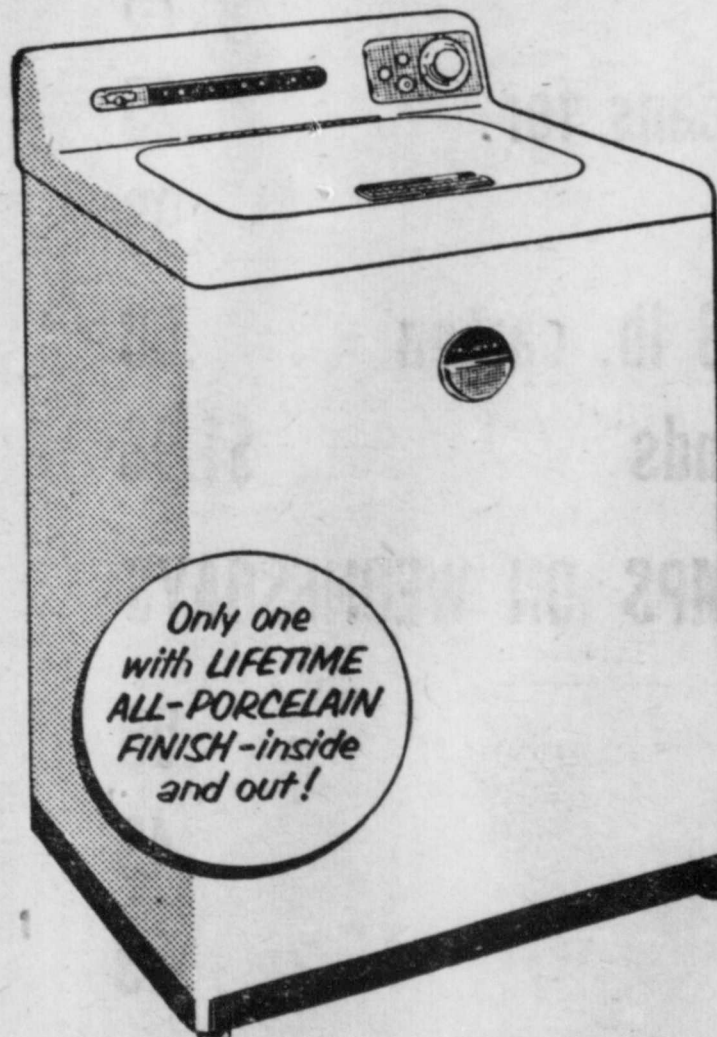
