Harvest Festival Program

The Hedley Schools will present a school program Thursday, November 27, at 7:30 PM in the high school auditorium. Each class has a representative princess who is candidate for the position of Princess Royal in the grades, or Queen of the Festival in high school. This contest is to be decided by vote as usual, the contest closing at 4:00 PM Thursday, Nov. 27, before the coronation ceremony.

Each class from the first grade through the twelfth is to have all money from tickets sold by themselves. All gate receipts go to the library fund. After the coronation ceremony a program is to be given as a command performance before the Queen.

The theme of this program will be built around American traditions and customs highlighting such topics as the Pilgrim Fathers, Indians, Virginia Colonials, Southern plantation negroes; Spanish-American and modern songs and folk dances also will be used. The Thanksgiving motif as well as the patriotic will be interwoven in such a manner as to produce an entertaining and instructive program.

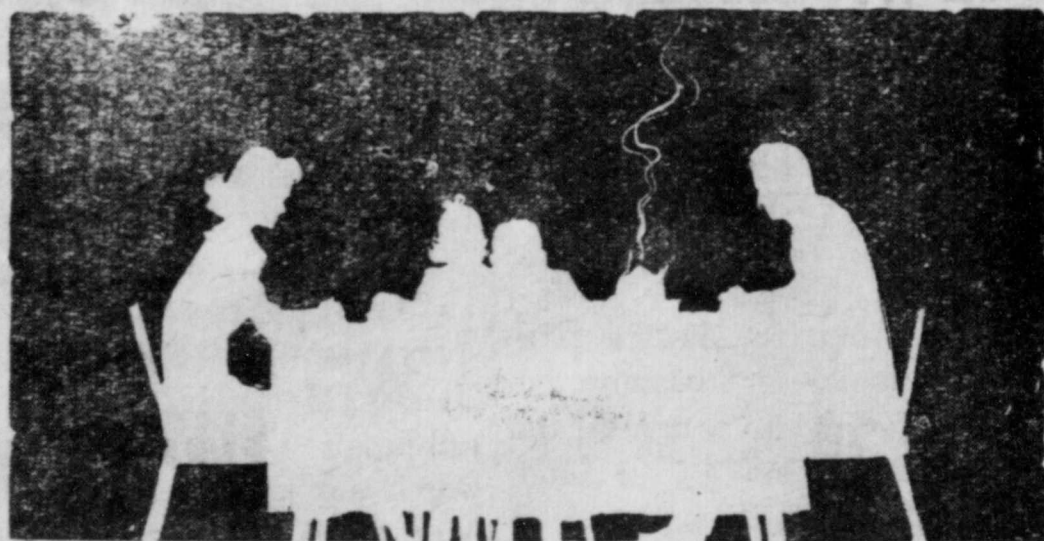

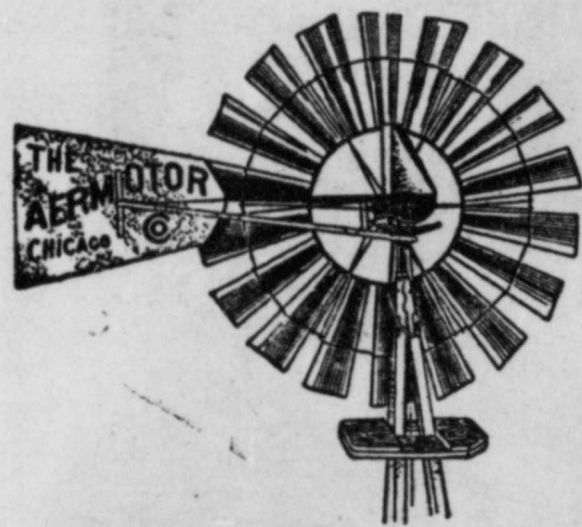
J. A. Bowling Dies

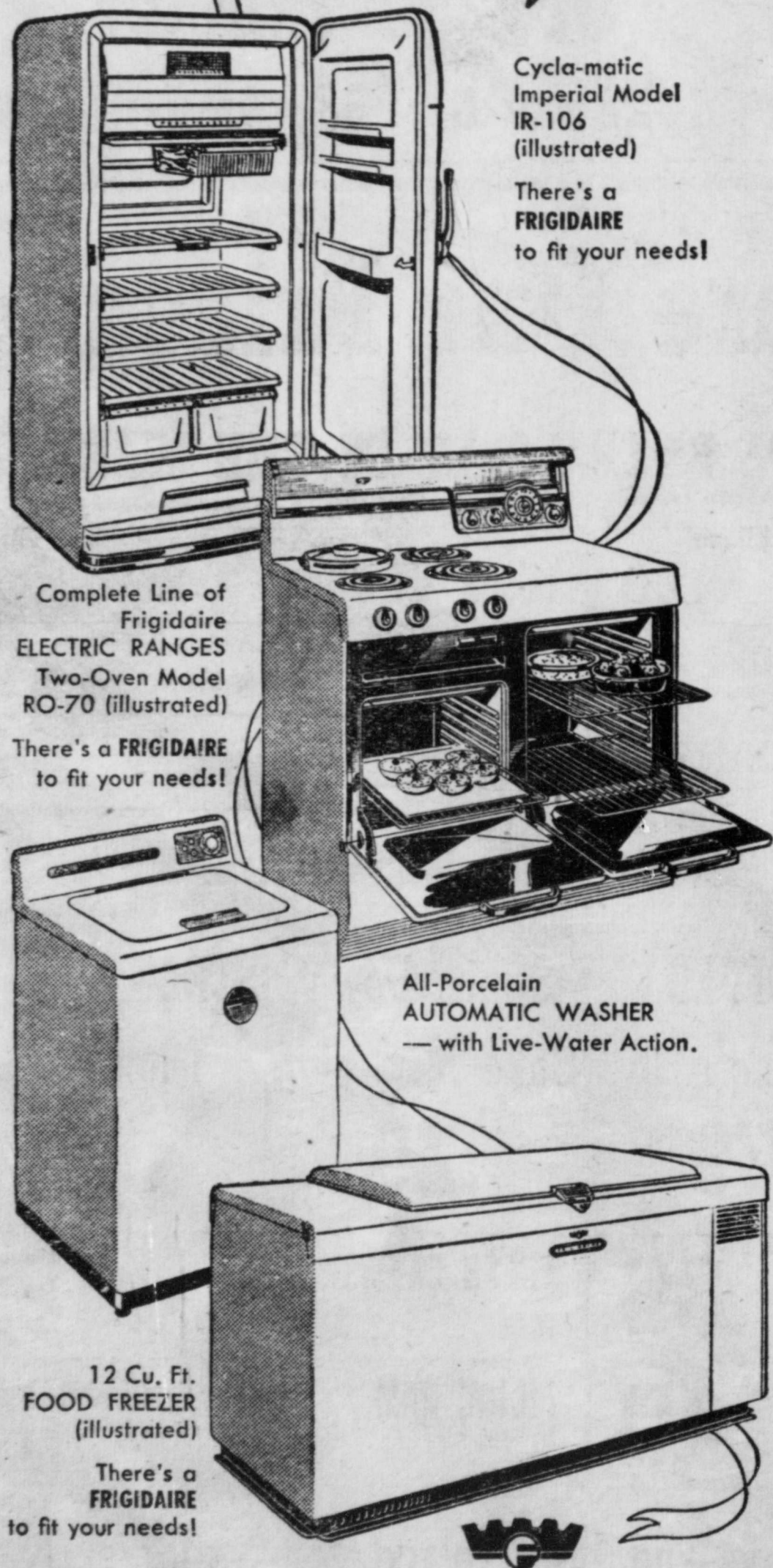

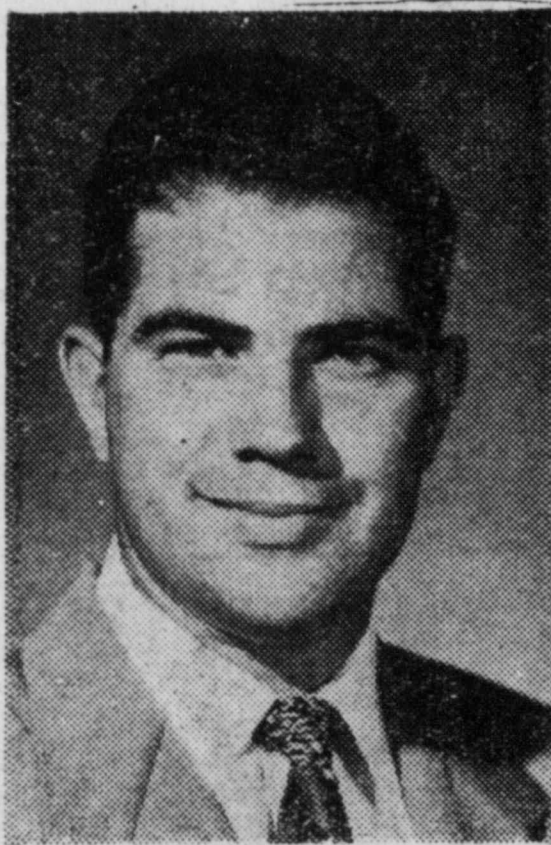

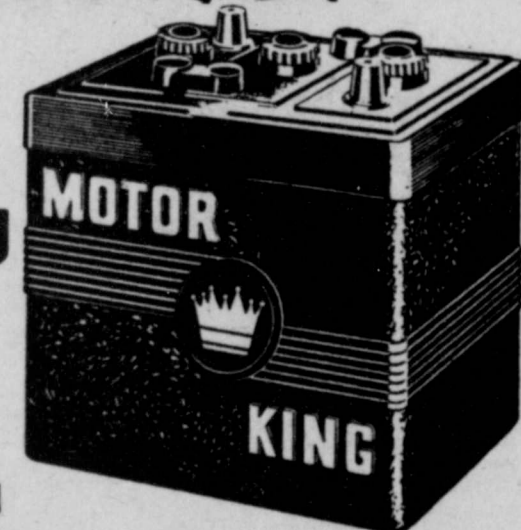
