# Harvest Festival Program

The Hedley Schools will present a school program Thursday, November 27, at 7:30 PM in the high school auditorium. Each class has a representative princess who is candidate for the position of Princess Royal in the grades, or Queen of the Festival in high school. This contest is to be decided by vote as usual, the contest closing at 4:00 PM Thursday, Nov. 27, before the coronation ceremony.

The boys and girls basketball teams both won games from Kirkland here Tuesday night. The boys won by a score of 62 to 48, and the girls won theirs 54 to 29.


