

E, D & P Ry. Company, Donley County, Texas, which land is more fully described in said application; the water to be diverted by means of a pumping plant. The proposed pumping plant is located at a point which bears East 390 feet and North 40 feet from the Southeast corner of Section 106, Block E, D & P Ry. Company, on the West bank of Lake Creek, in Donley County, Texas, and is distant in an easterly direction from Clarendon, Texas, about twelve (12) miles.
