Car Tags Must Be On By April 1st

Sheriff Truett Behrens announced this week that April 1st is the date that all vehicles being operated on the public roads are to have the 1953 license plates attached.

The 1952 license receipt and certificate of title is required to purchase the 1953 plates.

The Tax Office in Clarendon will close at five o'clock Tuesday afternoon, March 31, and no Transfers of Title will be made on Monday and Tuesday, March 30 and 31.

Only about half the plates have been sold, which will create a terrific rush in the Tax Office these few remaining days.

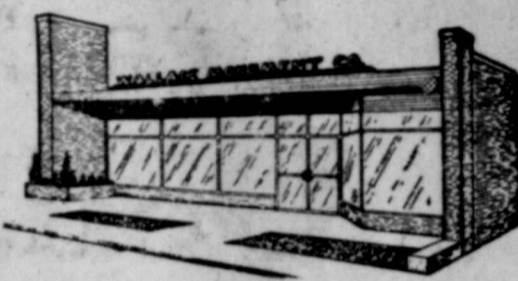

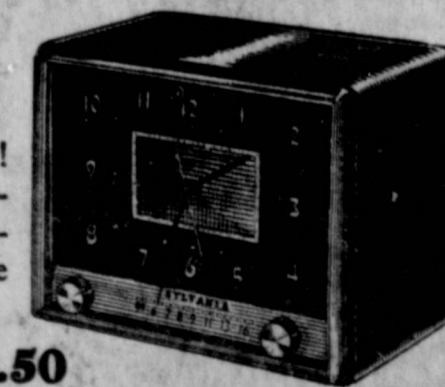

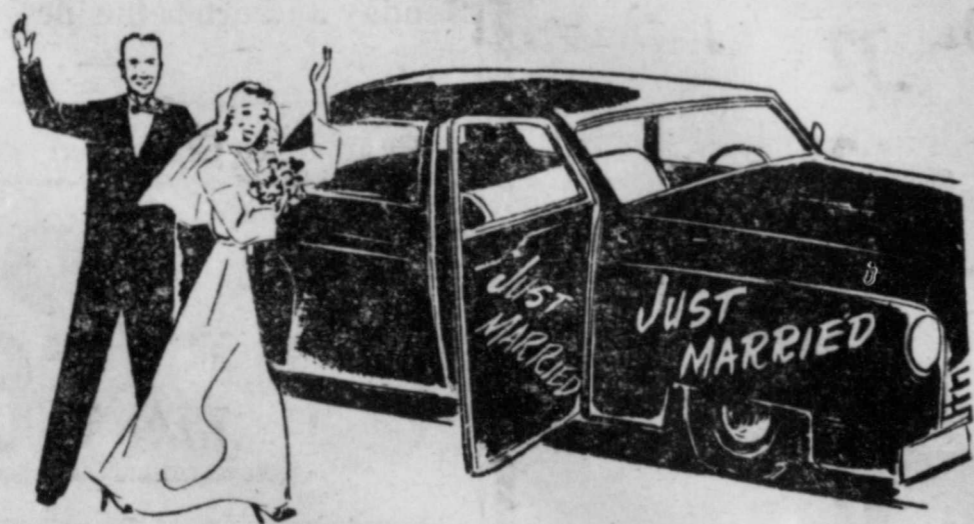
