Christal, the postoffice address of whom is Lelia Lake, Texas, on the 30th day of March, 1953, filed his application in the office of the Board of Water Engineers for the State of Texas, in which he applies for a permit to appropriate of the unappropriated waters of the State of Texas, from Lake Creek, a tributary of the Salt Fork of Red River, in Donley County, Texas, not to exceed 160 acre-feet of water per annum, for the irrigation of not to exceed 155.4 acres of land out of Section 65, Block C-6, G. C. & S. F. Ry. Co Survey, Donley County, Texas, which land is more fully described in said application; water to be diverted by means of a portable pump.
