



Explorer Bivouac

Hedley Explorers attended the Adobe Walls Council Emergency Service Training Bivouac last Friday, Saturday and Sunday at Camp Don Harrington at the mouth of Palo Duro Canyon near Amarillo.

The purpose of the meet was to teach Explorers the facts of emergency service, including first aid lost persons, etc. The boys first meeting on Friday night was interrupted by a report of a lost rancher in the rugged canyon area. Over 100 boys and leaders fanned out thorough two hour search. Returning to base the boys were informed that the "lost" rancher had been found. It was actually a test to determine the actions of each post in the event such a service did have to be performed. Hedley's group was under the leadership of Advisor Bob Harris, and R. M. Saunders and Henry Phone 45 Moore of the Post Committee. They received top honors for their thoroughness and determination during the search. Refreshments were served Friday night.

On Saturday the Healey group demonstrated fire arms safety and spent a good part of the day on the Scout Rifle Range under the supervision of R. M. Saunders. Rifle and pistol safety, marksmane ship and care were taught.

Realistic first aid training was suddenly brought before the boys when they were sent up a canyon area and stumbled on to several bad "accidents." Gunshot wounds, snake bites, fractured wrists, electric wire victims, and even a fish hook snagged in a boy's ear came before the startled explorers. In each case the injury had been expertly illusioned by make up and props. Realistic injuries called for realistic actions, and standing by was a judge and expert advisor adding suggestions and cautions. The boys learned a great deal of how to cope with the unexpected.

Scout Chapel services were held Sunday morning winding up the exciting three day event. Highlights of the trip were the camp cooked meals. Henry Moore was kitchen boss for the trip with R M. Saunders and Bob Harris as his assistant chefs. In four meals the boys consumed 8 dozen eggs, 5 lbs. of ham, 6 lbs. of bacon, 15 lbs of potatoes, 6 lbs. of butter, 12 lbs. of steak, 14 qts. of milk, 8 dozen biscuits, and 7 loaves of bread, not to mention the cans of corn, beans, and peas, jelly and sweet rolls! No one was atlowed to leave the meal until he publicly stated he had had enough to eat.

The Explorers had an exceptional time and wish to express their deep appreciation to the people

who helped to make the trip possible and especially to Henry Moore and R. M. Saunders for companionship.

Scouts Bill Reeves and Deward Gibson accompanied the explorers as observers for Troop 36.
