Box Rent Increased

The Hedley post office has announced changes in box rents effective July 1, 1953. The schedule now in effect has not been changed since 1907 and the increased charges are made to conform with the increased cost of providing the equipment and maintaining service.

Boxes now 35¢ will be increased to 65¢, 45¢ boxes to 90¢, and 60¢ boxes to \$1.10.

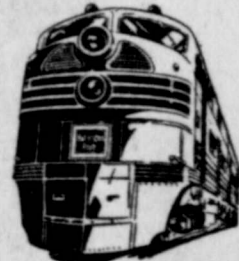



Hedley citizens are reminded that there is a City Ordinance which has been in effect for many years, which prohibits dogs running at large within the city limits of Hedley, without a tax of \$1.00 to \$2.50 having been paid annually, and without a numbered collar, with the number of said collar corresponding with the year in which the annual tax has been assessed.

Any dog found running at large without such numbered collar will be destroyed. Tags can be obtained for \$1.00 at the City Hall. We will start enforcing this in the near future.
