If we get more rain and make a forage crop this fall county agent H. M. Breedlove advises that it will be the time to put this feed in a trench silo. Cane, sargo, hegari, other grain and sweet sorghums will make good silage and this is the cheapest way to feed your cattle this winter. There will be a definite shortage of feed this winter and silage could relieve the feed situation a great deal for livestock producers.

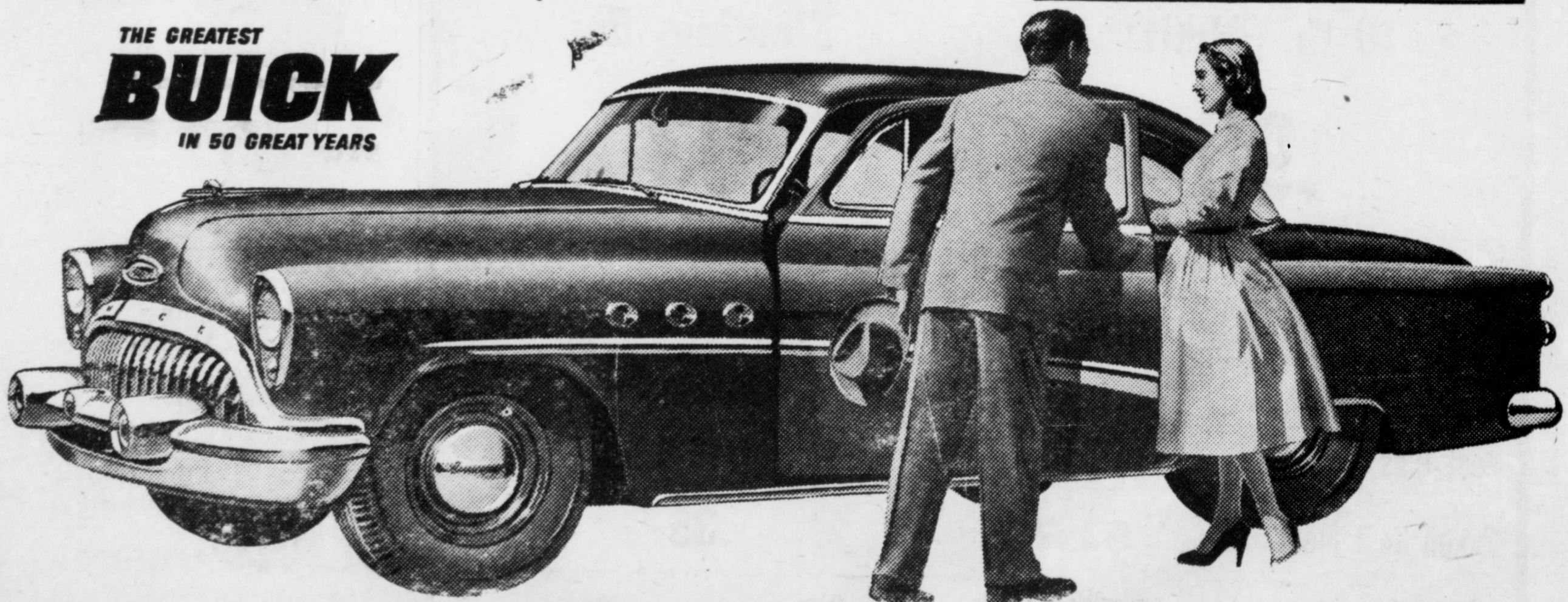

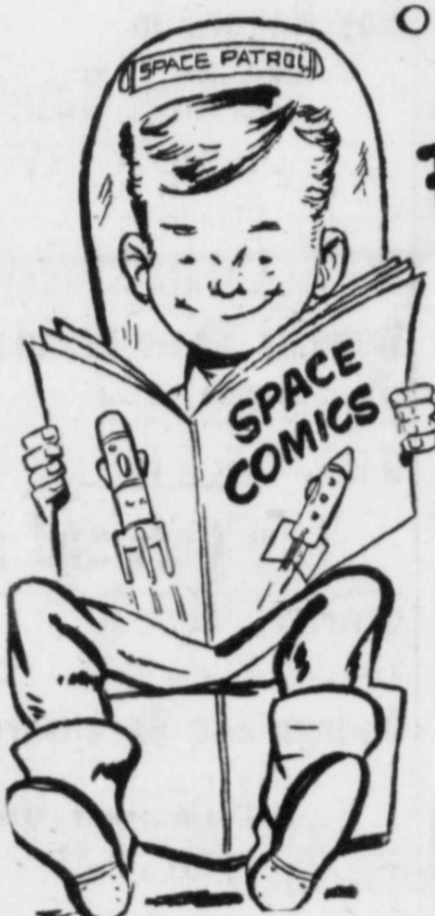
