## Attend Hearing on Salt Fork Dam

At the hearing of the State Water Board in Austin last Monday permission was granted the "Upper Basin of the Red River Water Association" to construct a dam on the Salt Fork of Red River.

The dam is to be located just above and west of the present crossing of the river which is north of the Bray schoolhouse. The specifications call for an 80 foot high earthen dam with a concrete spillway. Permission was granted to impound 25,000 acre feet of water. The association was given one year to start construction of the dam.

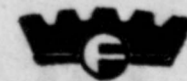
