## W. T. Merrill Dies

Funeral services for William Thomas Merrill, 71 years old of Hedley, were conducted at 2 PM last Friday in the First Methodist Church at Estelline. Rev. E. H. Coston, pastor, Rev. Ross Davis, pastor of the Assembly of God Church at Childress officiated. Burial was in the Tell Childress County cemetery under direction of Murphy-Spicer Funeral Home of Memphis.

Mr. Merrill died Wednesday night in a Childress County hospital. He had been ill for about a month.

He was born at Paducah, Tenn., April 1, 1882. He accompanied his parents when they came to Texas in 1894 and settled at Wolf City. On Dec. 24, 1905 he married Miss Minnie Latimer in Hunt County.

The family came to Hall County in 1925 and farmed in the Tell community until moving to Estelline in 1932. Beginning in 1944 Mr. Merrill was employed as a maintenance man with the Fort Worth and Denver Railroad, and later in Hedley in same capacity.

He retired a few years ago and the family home had been in Hedley since that time.

Survivors include his widow, Minnie; four daughters, Mrs. Hurschel Wolf, Estelline; Mrs. Cecil Stigall, Lone Oak; Mrs. Owen Knight, Hooks; Mrs. Nadine Lewis, Bakersfield, Calif.; three sons, Melvin of Amarillo; Alvin of Estelline, Y. B. of Childress, two brothers, Jack of Abilene and Grover of Honey Grove; 24 grandchildren four great grandchildren.

## Meeting Called On Salt Fork Dam

A meeting has been called to be held in Paducah at 8 PM Tuesday, November 24, to consider the formation of a water district to get the ball rolling on the Salt Fork Dam project. Towns that show interest and have contributed to the project are Hedley, Clarendon, Memphis, Wellington, Childress, Paducah and Quanah.

The engineering data, on which the permit was granted to dam the Salt Fork, was prepared by A. H. Woolverton, Consulting Engineer of Austin. The dam is to be capable of impounding 100,000 acre feet of water of which 25,000 acre feet can be used each year. The present plan for financing the dam is by the issuance of revenue bonds.

It is hoped that a large delegation from Hedley will attend this meeting.
