Farm Bureau News

Resolutions passed at the state convention at Mineral Wells were read and discussed. Mr. Moore and Slayton Mahaffey gave a good report on the state convention and Mr. Hoyle discussed the passed resolutions. The Farm Bureau went on record as favoring an increase in 1954 cotton allotments and voted to back this movement on the county, state and national level. Lee Shaller was elected secretary and treasurer for 1954 as the present secretary has resigned due to illness.

Mr. Moore says that the Donley County Farm Bureau will have a drive to increase its membership and make it one of the strongest in this section. The directors voted to meet once a month to discuss business.

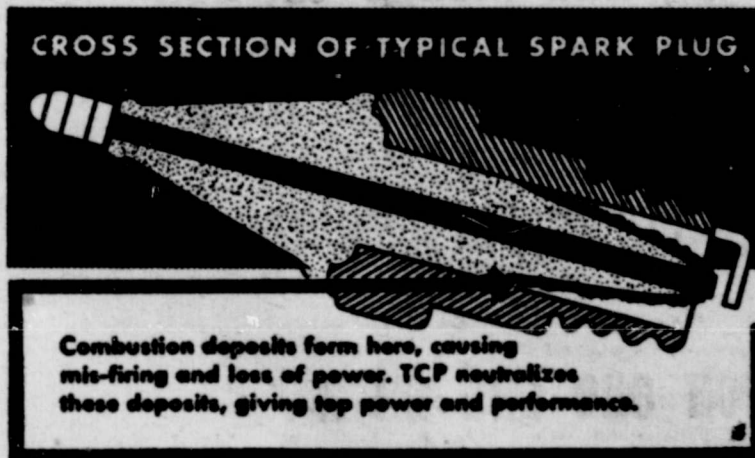
