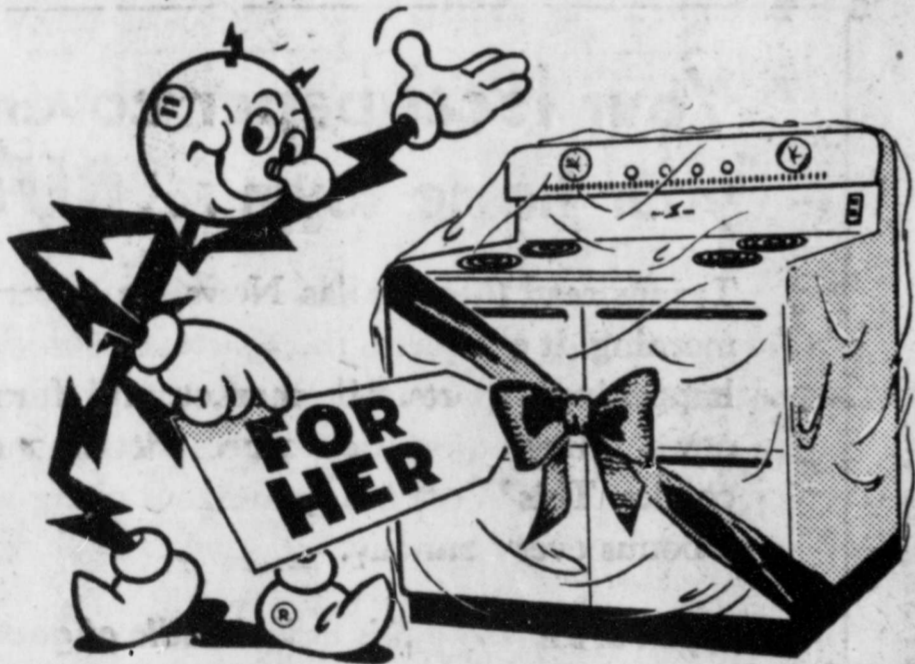

(Makes about 8 dozen 2-inch cookies)

| 1½ cups brown sugar | 3 cups sifted all-purpose flour |
| ½ cup granulated sugar | ½ cup undiluted Carnation Evaporated Milk |

| ¼ teaspoon salt | |
