Guilty, but not Condemned

A sinful woman stood before Jesus and the most wonderful words she had ever heard were spoken to her. "And Jesus said unto her, Neither do I condemn thee: go and sin no more." (John 8:11)

Around the woman stood her accusers who were more interested in trapping Jesus than in punishing her for her sin. They wanted to know what His answer would be. The law of Moses provided a death penalty for that sin. "What sayest thou?" they sneered at Him. If He had upheld the woman, they could have said He condoned her sin and if He agreed to immediate stoning He could be reminded that He had been a Friend to sinners and was therefore inconsistent. But Jesus trapped them with their own snare. "He that is without sin among you let him first cast a stone at her," He said. And while He stooped and wrote again on the ground they were so convicted by their own consciences that they went out one by one until only Jesus and the woman remained.

Some would have us believe by this incident that Jesus did not condemn sin, but was willing to overlook it. Nothing could be farther from the truth as the Scriptures plainly testify. But although Jesus does condemn sin everywhere it is found, He does not mercilessly condemn the sinner. By the sacrifice of Himself on the Cross He is able to make us free from sin. His words to this woman are His words to everyone who stands before Him guilty of sin and penitent in spirit, "Go and sin no more."

Of course the sin of adultery, or any other sin is black and hideous in the sight of God. But remember one of the blackest of all sins is the sin of those Pharisees, which was the sin of judging another harshly while judging themselves easily.

We know no more about this woman, but we can be sure she did sin no more, for a meeting with Jesus always changes anyone who experiences it.

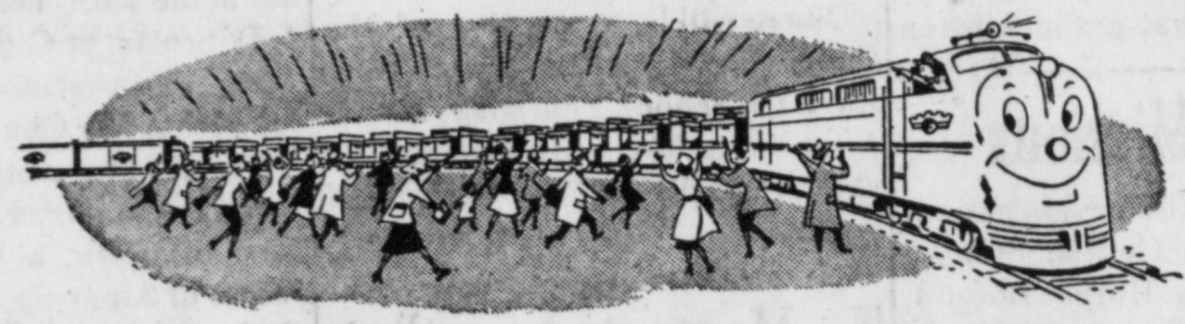

The 30 patrolmen of this district investigated 91 rural accidents during the month and made 524 arrests, 200 of them for speeding.

A total of 3 persons were killed, 48 injured, and property damage of \$72,835 was suffered in rural accidents during January.

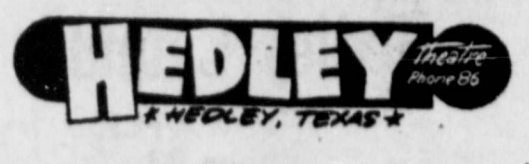
