## Fred Tidwell Dies

Funeral services for Fred T. Tidwell, who passed away last Wednesday at Albuquerque, were held Friday from the Church of Christ here by Minister Shelby Sanders of Hedley and Minister J. C. Stepp of Lelia Lake.

Burial was in Rowe cemetery with Murphy-Spicer Funeral Home in charge.

Pallbearers were Chester Walker, Olon Plunk, Bill Clay, Herman Kirkpatrick, O. C. Sargent, and Fred Bourland.

Mr. Tidwell was born April 5, 1915 in Franklin County, Texas, and came to Donley County with his parents while an infant. After the death of his mother when he was a year old, he was reared by Mr. and Mrs. J. W. DeBord of McKnight.

He graduated from Hedley High School in 1932. He was a veteran of World War II and was a member of the McKnight Church of Christ and the Hedley American Legion post.

He is survived by his father and stepmother, Mr. and Mrs. J. M. Tidwell of Hedley, a brother, Marion, of Hedley, a sister, Mrs. Hester Adams of McLean, and half-sisters, Mrs. Frances Satterwhite of Longview and Miss Sue Tidwell of Hedley.

He had been working at Albuquerque, where he was employed as a salesman for a bakery.

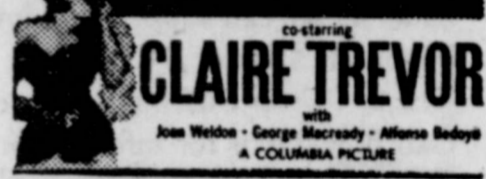

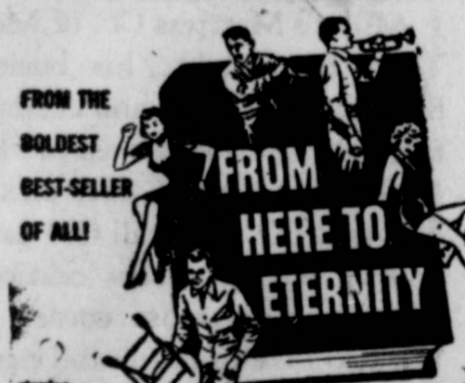
