During his 35 years here, Mr. Mann has always been active in community affairs. He united with the Christian Church at an early age, and he and his family were instrumental in reorganizing the First Christian Cnurch here few years ago. He was a charter member of the Hedley Lions Club, as well as an elder in the Christian Church. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Minnie Mann of Hedley; one son, Capt. Everett E. 




