Funeral services for T. E. Johnson, well known Amarillo newspaperman who passed away last Thursday, were held in Amarillo Friday. He was 54 years old and had been in a hospital for some time.

A native of Cooper, he worked for several newspapers, including the Amarillo News and Times, Memphis Democrat, Moore County News, Dalhart Texan, Wichita Daily Times and Pueblo (Colo.) Chieftain.

He is survived by his wife; three daughters, Mrs. J. D. Wooddell, Mrs. Hampton Stennis and Marianne Johnson of Amarillo; one son, Tommy Johnson of the U. S. Marines; three brothers, Chas. Y. Johnson and Theo Johnson of Amarillo and L. H. Johnson of Dallas; three sisters, Mrs. Francis Schenck of Lubbock, Mrs. Irene Frisbie of Memphis and Mrs. Radell Latimer of Amarillo; and five grandchildren.

News From Our County Agent

It is only a short time now until cotton will be up all over the county, and with the good moisture we have at the present time there will probably be a rapid growth and conditions will be perfect for cotton insects to start working on the young cotton. Farmers are warned by county agent H. M. Breedlove to keep a very close check on their cotton and to start their insect control program at the very first signs of harmful insects.

Cotton flea hoppers and leaf worms will probably be the first insects to make their appearance and then the boll worms. Breedlove says that spraying or dusting cotton with good poisons will completely control cotton insects started in plenty of time.

Spraying of cotton for cotton flea hoppers, leaf worms and worms, toxaphene and T the 2-1 mix is one of the use, and for dusting the mix gives very good results. Other good poisons, as one mentioned above give results and can be obtained locally.

Keep watch of that cotton the very start, says the agent, and if you need any sure to call on him when you determine that to be used.

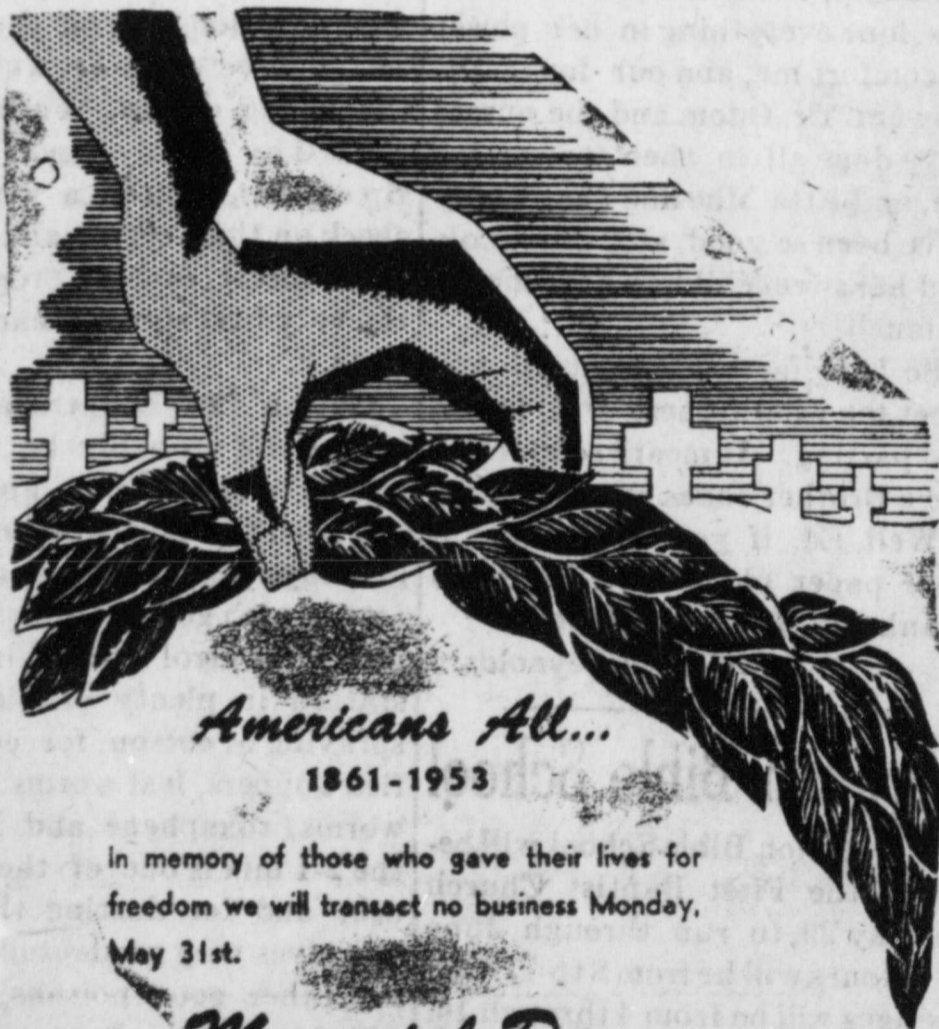

News From Our County Agent

Grasshoppers have begun to make their appear in some parts of the county, says county agent H. M. Breedlove. Now is the time to poison those hoppers while they are still in the hatch area and are concentrated to small patches. When the hoppers get more age they will migrate to larger areas and poisoning will become much more difficult.

Some good poisons that have given good results for grasshopper control are toxaphene, aldrin, dieldrin and endrin. These poisons are used as a spray.

The best places to look for the hatches of the young hoppers says the county agent, are along fence rows and in low places where water has stood. 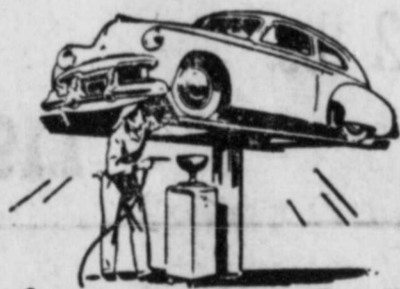

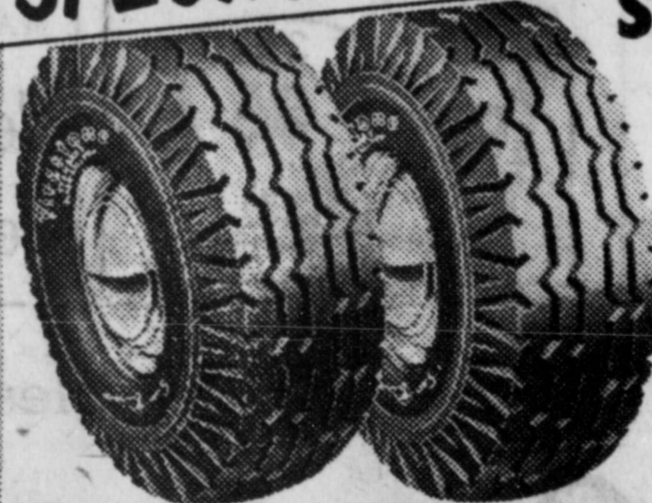

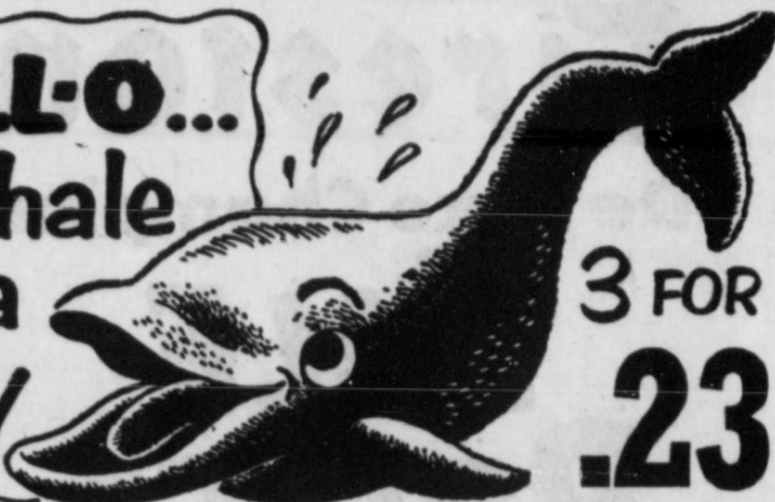
