## Clarendon Celebration Set For July 2, 3 and 4

A free barbecue and four rodeo performances will highlight the annual Fourth of July Celebration at Clarendon. The celebration dates have been set for July 2nd, 3rd and 4th.

Rodeo performances will be held on Friday night July 2nd, Saturday afternoon and night of July 3rd and Sunday afternoon July 4th. Afternoon performances will start at 2 PM and the night performances will begin at 8 PM. A \$3,500.00 purse will attract amateur contestants from near and far. All contestant entrees must be in by 3 PM July 2nd.

A free barbecue with all the trimmings will be served on the court house lawn Saturday, July 3rd, beginning at 11:30 AM. Over 4,000 pounds of beef will be barbecued to feed an expected 6,000 visitors. The Western Parade will follow at 1 o'clock, which will feature Rodeo Queen contestants, horseback riders, floats, etc.

The Clarendon American Legion Post will be in charge of the dances which will be held three nights, July 1st, 2nd and 3rd. Emmett Allen and his Sunset Ramblers will furnish the music.

The Clarendon Outdoor Entertainment Association is extending an invitation to everyone to come and enjoy Clarendon's hospitality on these three days.

The Clarendon Boosters will be in Hedley Saturday afternoon at 3:45 to advertise their celebration.

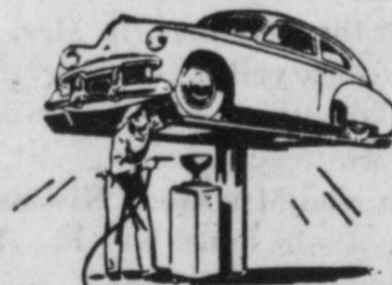
