## Clarendon Celebration Set For July 2, 3 and 4

Everything is in readiness to entertain thousands of visitors in Clarendon July 2nd, 3rd and 4th. This annual celebration is the oldest Fourth of July Celebration in the Panhandle. Ranchers and Clarendon businessmen have made it a policy to keep this celebration in line with the pioneer spirit by offering a free barbecue with no strings attached on July 3rd. H. M. "Flip" Breedlove, County Agent for Donley County, is the barbecue king and has the reputation for putting out barbecue with all the trimmings equal to that served anywhere. Twelve lines will be set up on the court house square to handle the serving, which will begin at 11:30 AM July 3rd and 108 people will be on hand to handle the serving. Approximately 6,000 visitors were served in an hours time last year.

Rodeo performances will be held on Friday night July 2nd, Saturday afternoon and night of July 3rd and Sunday afternoon July 4th. Afternoon performances will start at 2 PM and the night performances will begin at 8 PM. A \$3,500.00 purse will attract amateur contestants from near and far. All contestant entrees must be in by 3 PM July 2nd.

A big Western Parade will follow the serving of the barbecue dinner on July 3rd at 1 o'clock. Featured in the parade will be the twenty-five Rodeo Queen Contestants sponsored by Clarendon merchants, along with numerous horseback riders, floats, etc.

The Clarendon American Legion Post will be in charge of the dances which will be held three nights, July 1st, 2nd and 3rd. Emmett Allen and his Sunset Ramblers will furnish the music.

Clarendon has the welcome sign hanging out for all visitors.

## TB Survey

"Searchlight on TB," a statewide study of the disease which is called Texas' No. 1 health problem, was focused on the Texas Panhandle Wednesday at a meeting in Amarillo, attended by County Judge Jack Gray.

Representatives from the 26 counties which comprise survey Area 1 attended a meeting in the News-Globe Conference Room, to discuss means of bringing to light all information bearing on tuberculosis in their home counties.

## Attention Farmers

Proper management of small grain stubble this summer is going to have great effect on how much your land will produce next spring and also on your yields next year.

Because our summer precipitation is usually rather scanty, often torrential, it is imperative that the soil be managed so as to allow it to absorb and retain as much moisture as possible. In this district generally, wetted tend to run together and seal at the surface thus preventing the water to enter the soil.

Under such conditions, mulching comes into its own. Stubble mulch means plowing the land so as to leave a thick mulch of crop residue near the surface of the soil. This does a good job of deep type mulch. The first cultivation should be started soon as possible after harvest for the soil comes too hard and dry. The final cultivation is made at the greatest depth and successive cultivations should be shallower to insure a firm seed bed at planting time.

To offset the additional work of plowing you may use type implements with assistance at the rate of one acre under the Erorion Control application to the time.

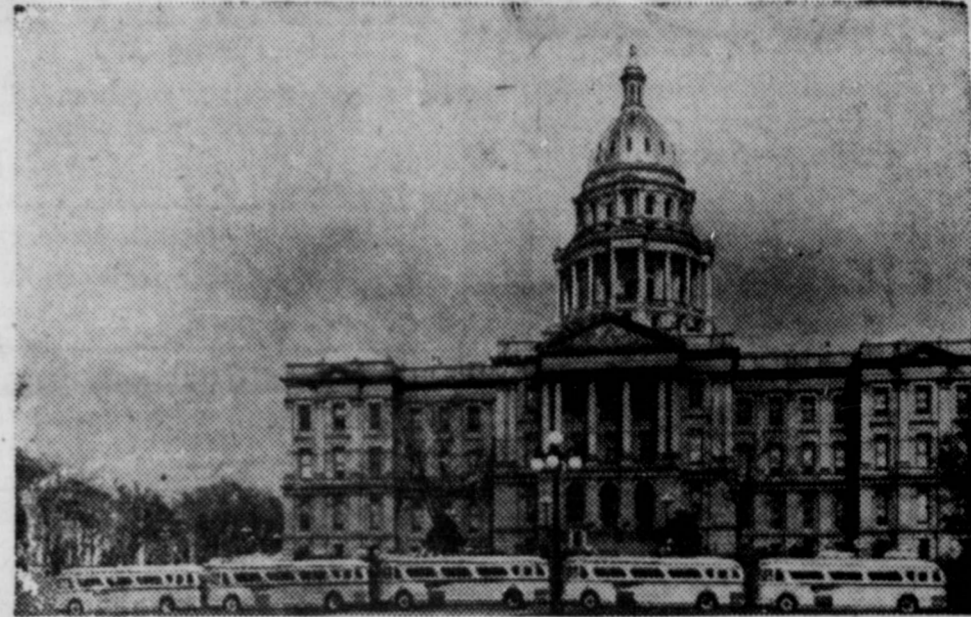

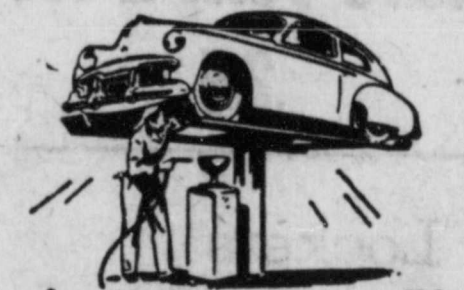

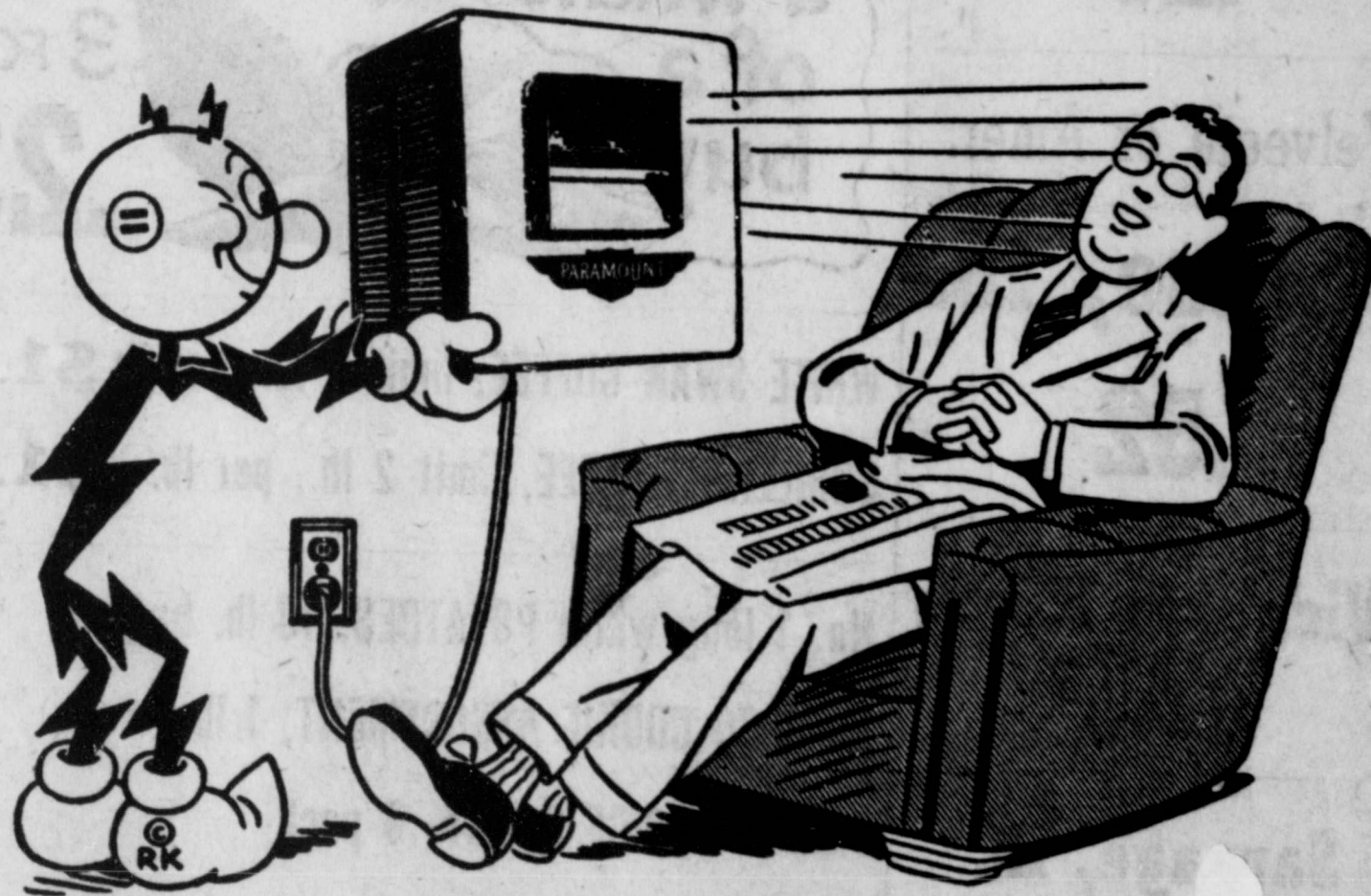
