Constitutional Amendments

Following is a brief outline of the 11 proposed amendments to the Texas Constitution to be voted on at the general election next Tuesday, November 2.

Senate Joint Resolution No authorizes the Legislature to increase state spending for old age assistance, aid to the blind, and aid to dependent children, by \$7,000,000 a year.

Senate Joint Resolution No. 6 permits a person who has served some time as a teacher and accumulated credits under the teacher's retirement system, and also some time as a state employee, with credits under the state employees' retirement system, to count his accumulated credits under both systems in determining his retirement pay.

Cancer Hospital Gets Birthday Party Research Grant

Austin-The American Cancer Society has allocated a cancer research grant of \$100,000 to the University of Texas M. D. Anderson Hospital for Cancer Research in Houston

The grant, which makes a total of \$440,766 given directly to the Hospital by the Cancer Society since 1948, will be for research projects during the 12 months which began September 1.

The money will aid studies at both the treatment and basic research levels at the hospital with emphasis on the effects of hormones and radiation Studies will range from careful measurements of the body chemistry of cancer patients under treatment with hormones to improvements in cancer surgery by replacing important body structures with frozen grafts or artificial materials.

The grant to M. D. Anderson was part of a \$5,530,000 allocation by the Cancer Society for its nationwide research program. This covered 45 institutional and special grants over the country, and the establishment of a half milliondollar fund for lung cancer investigation.

Money for the grants came from the 1954 Cancer Crusade.

Counting the M. D. Anderson grant, a total of \$169,848 in Ameri can Cancer Society research funds is now at work in Texas.




