Fat Stock Show

The Donley County Fat Stock Show will be held in Clarendon on January 26 at the old fair ground buildings on the Brice Highway says County Agent H. M. Breedlove. 4-H Club and FFA boys from all over the county will be competing with fat steers, swine and sheep. The vocational teachers from Hedley, Lelia Lake, and Clarendon will work with the county agent.

All livestock will be in the barns by 9:00 o'clock in the morning and remain in place until 4:30 in the afternoon. The show is being held in January because some of swine will go to the Fort Worth show. The steers will be shown at the Amarillo stock show in late February.

Light Steers: 1st \$25.00, 2nd \$15.00, 3rd \$5.00

In the swine division there will be six breeds composed of Chester Whites, Hampshires, Poland Chinas, Durocs, Berkshire and cross breed. Classes and premiums will be:

School Census

The School Census enumeration should be made before Jan. 31, 1955. All children born after Sept. 1, 1937 to Sept. 1, 1949 should be enumerated.

Children starting to school Sept. 1, 1955 are required to have a birth certificate. They cannot be enrolled if this certificate is not presented on the day of enrollment.
