District Tournament

The District Tournament is to be held Feb. 10, 11, and 12 at Groom. Hedley boys will play their first game there at 9:15 Thursday, Feb. 10, with Lelia Lake. Friday night the winner of this game will play Dodson, who drew a bye for the opening bracket. The opening games on the other half of the boys bracket are Claude vs. Samnorwood Friday night and Quail vs. Groom Thursday night. The winners of these two games will meet Saturday morning.

The final game to determine the district championship will be played Saturday night at 8:45. The Hedley boys have a good chance of getting in this game and winning the championship.

Basketball News

The heated controversy over the Hedley Samnorwood game Friday night was decided through the rule book. Here is the situation: with less than one minute to play Allen Cope was tangled with a double foul situation which proved to be his 5th personal foul. Walking to the free throw line, the ball was offered to him by the official. The throw was good, then the horn sounded notifying that Cope was supposed to go off the court. The official not knowing his rules wouldn't accept Cope's point. This led to an overtime as the clock showed 49 to 49. Samnorwood polished the game off 54 to 51. But after the game was over the official was cornered by Coach H. E. Martin of Hedley and shown the following rule.

Rule 2, Section 10 question (1): The scorers fail to notify the official that a player has committed his 5th personal foul and he remains in the game. What should be done?

Answer: Playing time consumed, if any, and points scored count. The offending player must be removed as soon as the official discovers the error. Scorers should notify an official as soon as a player commits his 5th personal foul, but if play is resumed before such notification, they should signal when the ball is next dead or is in control of the offending team.

This is the result, Hedley takes Samnorwood by one point 50 to 49 and the overtime does not count.

Closely following Reeves in the scoring department was Leon Bevers with 12, Don Reeves with 11, Allen Cope with 10, and Terry Bailey finished the scoring sheet with 4 points.
