Soil Stewardship

Next Sunday, May 15, is Soil Stewardship Sunday. Many ministers throughout the country will devote their sermons on this day to God's plan for man's stewardship of the land. The observance of this day in the local churches is sponsored by the Donley Soil Conservation District. It is sponsored nation wide by the National Association of Soil Conservation Districts.

Soil Stewardship Sunday had its formal beginning in 1946 when the publishers of Farm and Ranch magazine suggested to religious leaders of a few southern states that they set aside one Sunday each year to remind their congregations of man's duty to be a good steward of the land. So great was the response of ministers that observance of Soil Stewardship Sunday rapidly spread to numerous other states. Last year the National Association of Soil Conservation Districts agreed to assume responsibility for encouraging nation-wide participation in this program.

Booklets, containing excerpts from sermons delivered in various parts of the nation on the theme of soil stewardship, have been developed and made available to ministers for their use in preparing soil stewardship messages. Announcement of a 50 % divi- Boy Scout News dend by the Southern Farm Bureau Casualty Insurance Company means a savings of \$1,049.45 to farmers of Donley County, according to President Henry Moore of the local County Farm Bureau.

The farm leader said that 65 Farm Bureau members in the county would receive dividend payments. The amount each receives will be half of the amount of his premiums paid during the one year period ending March 31, 1955. Dividends will be paid in semi-annual payments, as policies come up for renewal.

Farm Bureau members in Texas have received 50 % dividends on their auto insurance premiums. Vance Gray, service agent for the County Farm Bureau, said that the dividends were made possible because farmers and ranchers were found to be preferred risks.

Since the Southern Farm Bursau Casualty Co. began providof Fort Sill, Okla., Mrs. Jimmie Bureau members in Texas, the premium rates for auto insurance for all farmers have decreased 20 % he said. 



MISSION LA BAHIA

Mission La Bahia, a few miles from Goliad, will ever remain a shrine of all Texans. It was built in 1749, and formed the nucleus of the settlement of Goliad, one of the three Spanish outposts in Texas, the other two being Nacogdoches and Bexar, now San Antonio. Here in 1812 Magee gave Salcedo, Mexican General, his first taste of Anglo-Saxon war tactics and here Col. J. W. Fannin and his men surrendered honorably to Urrea only to be slaughtered like dogs within sight of this mission. The massacre took place on Palm Sunday 1836, and of 357 Texans in that doomed band, only 27 escaped.


