

To The Public

It has been brought to the City's attention that dog poisoning has broken out again in Hedley, and that several pets have been killed, as well as stray dogs.

This is a very dangerous practice. We quote Art. 1373, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas:

"Whoever shall willfully maim, wound or disfigure any horse, ass, mule, cattle, sheep, goat, swine, dog or other domesticated animal, or whoever shall willfully kill, maim, wound, poison or disfigure and dog, domesticated bird or fow! of another with intent to injure the owner thereof, shall be fined

not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00). In prosecution under this Article the intent to injure may be presumed from the perpetration of the act."

If notified of stray dogs, the City will attempt to dispose of them, but not by poisoning.
