

News From Our County Agent

County Agent H. M. Breedlove announced this morning that cotton burrs would be available this: fall for farmers to haul home and put on their land. Arrangements have been made by the gins in th county to add larger fans to com ply with the pink boll worm con trol law.

Breedlove says that in the pact few years some of our best con servation has gone up in smoke. Cotton burrs added to Land at the Lubbock Experiment Station has increased cotton production as much as fifty pounds of lint per acre and has been very beneficial in controlling blowing of the land.

Gins will not be able to hold large stacks of burrs around the gin because of fire hazards a lack of space, so farmers wil required to load the burrs r. after ginning cotton. Fart can haul the burrs home, put the in a big stack, and then put the on the land this winter when th are not so busy.
