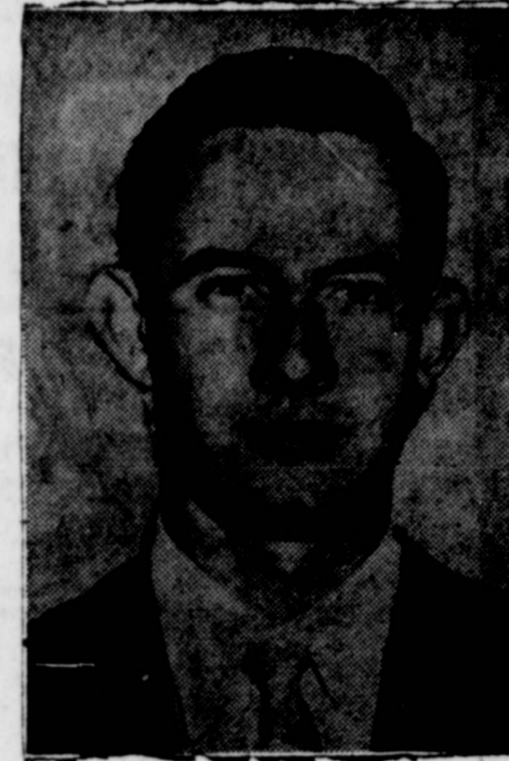

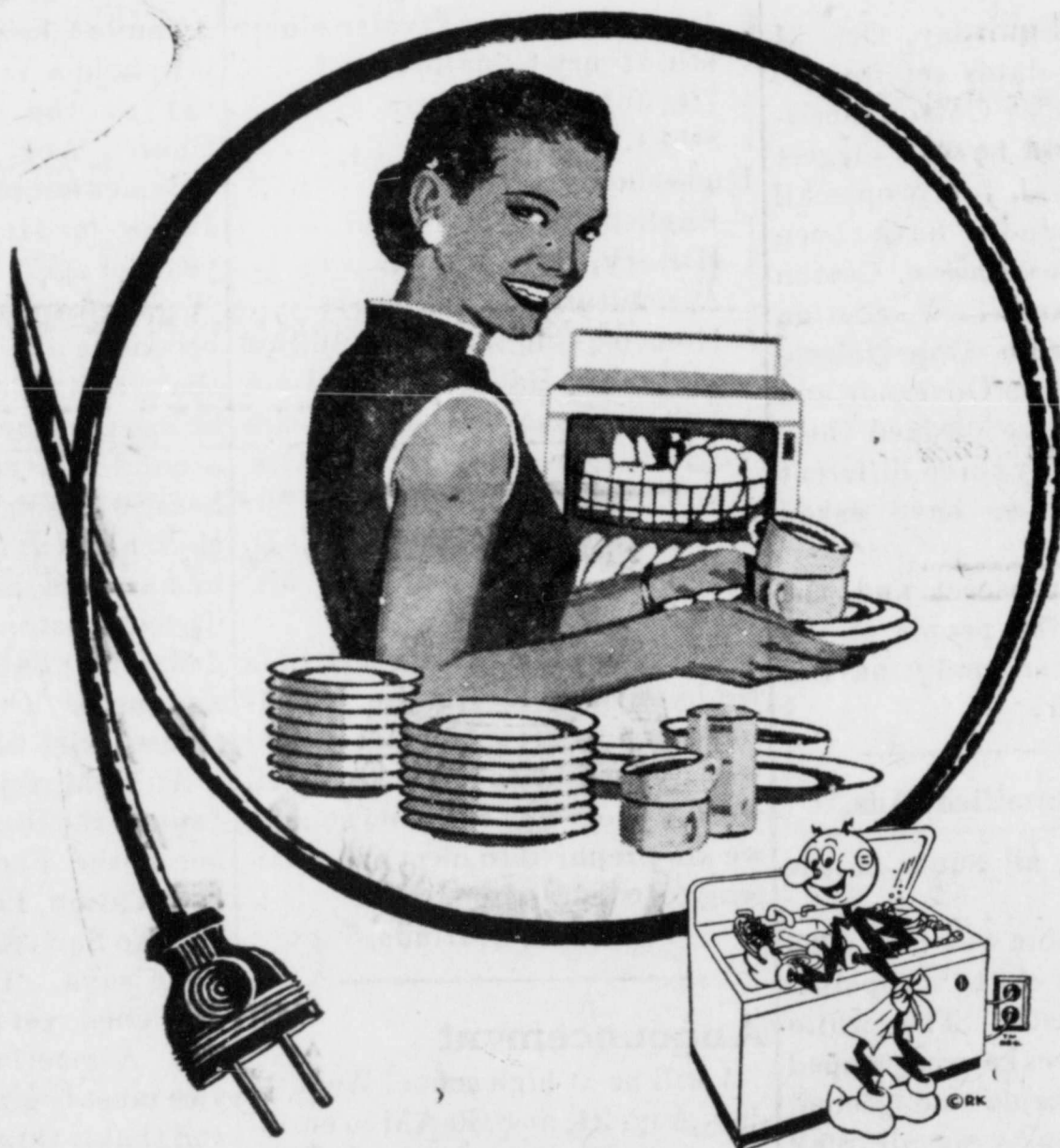

**Federal Land Bank Loan Limit Is Raised**

Sterling C. Evans, President of The Federal Land Bank of Houston has advised the officers of The Donley County National Farm Loan Association that President Eisenhower has signed into law, a bill passed by Congress, raising to \$200,000.00 the Federal Loan available to one individual farmer or rancher.

Heretofore, loans to one owner have been limited to \$100,000.00, according to Rayburn L. Smith, Secretary-Treasurer of the local Association. He feels that the needs of members can be better served in many cases by a larger loan.

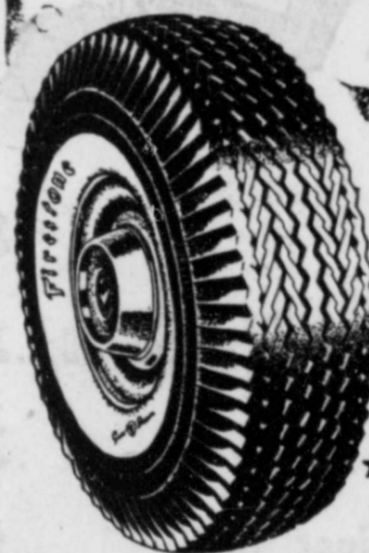


