This work has been in progress since July 9, they have used all local labor and bought all materials locally, and have had a payroll of over \$200 per week, Mr. Chesser stated.

The elevator has been completely rebuilt and its capacity doubled, making it now hold around 400,000 lbs All new machinery has been installed. The new loader wili load a box car every 40 minutes.
