Hedley's first bale of 1955 Cotton was brought in Saturday by Homer Durham, landlord Alva Simmons. It was ginned by the Paymaster Gin free of charge. Field weights were 1750 lbs. and the bale weighed 472 lbs. The Hedley Booster Club bid 40¢ a pound for the cotton.
