A contract for new construction on U.S. Highway 66 in Gray and Donley Counties has been awarded to a Lubbock firm, it was announced in Austin this week by the State Highway Commission.

J. R Fanning submitted the low bid of \$775 483 26 on the project. Construction of grading, structures, flexible base and asphaltic concrete pavement from near S. H. 70 west to Carson County line is expected to take 275 working days, according to James G. Lott, District Highway Engineer at Amar Ilo.






