Whereas, the Governor of the State of Texas by proclamation has further requested all citizens of the State of Texas to observe Friday, November 11, 1955 as Veterans Day,

Now, Therefore, I, C. H. Reid, Mayor of the City of Hedley, Texas, do hereby call upon all the citizens of Hedley, Texas to observe Friday, November 11, 1955, as Veterans Day. I request all citizens of this City business enterprises, veterans' organizations and city officials to assist the State Committee for the observance of Veterans Day in every way possible for the observance of November 11, 1955, with appropriate ceremonies.

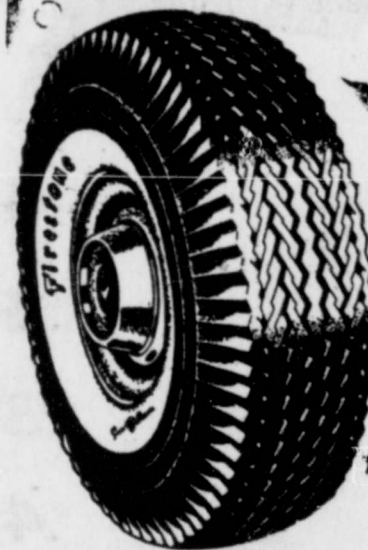

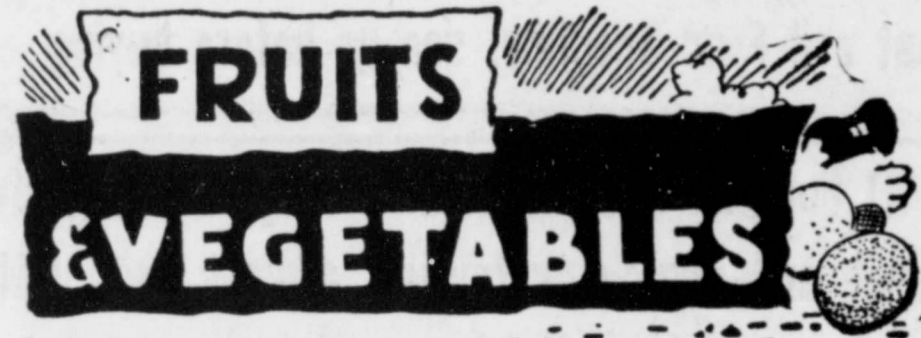
