News From Our County Agent

4-H Club boys in Donley County are feeding seventeen steers for major show in Texas, says County Agent H. M. Breedlove. The fair board in Donley County will be called into a meeting in the very near future to set the dates of the Donley County Fat Stock show. Other shows in which steers fed by Donley County 4-H Club members will be shown are at Amarillo, Odessa, Fort Worth and Houston. These entries are being made at this time. All of the shows will be after the first of the year.

Breedlove says that livestock entries this year will be some of the heaviest ever shown by Donley 4-H Club members. Weights of steers at the present time range from six hundred to over a thousand pounds.

Boys feeding steers are Gary and Tom Longan, Ted Shaller, William Chamberlain, Ronnie Longan, Jimmie Gattis, Chuck Cosper, Gene Floyd, Jim Waddell, and Troy Harrison.

These two men were the official voting delegates from Donley Co. They reported a successful meeting. Several policies were passed to benefit farmers. One of the most outstanding was the vote to hold cotton prices to 90% parity. Another was against transferring cotton acreage from one farm to another when two or more farms are under one contract.

Some leading men were there from other states to give very interesting talks on farm problems.

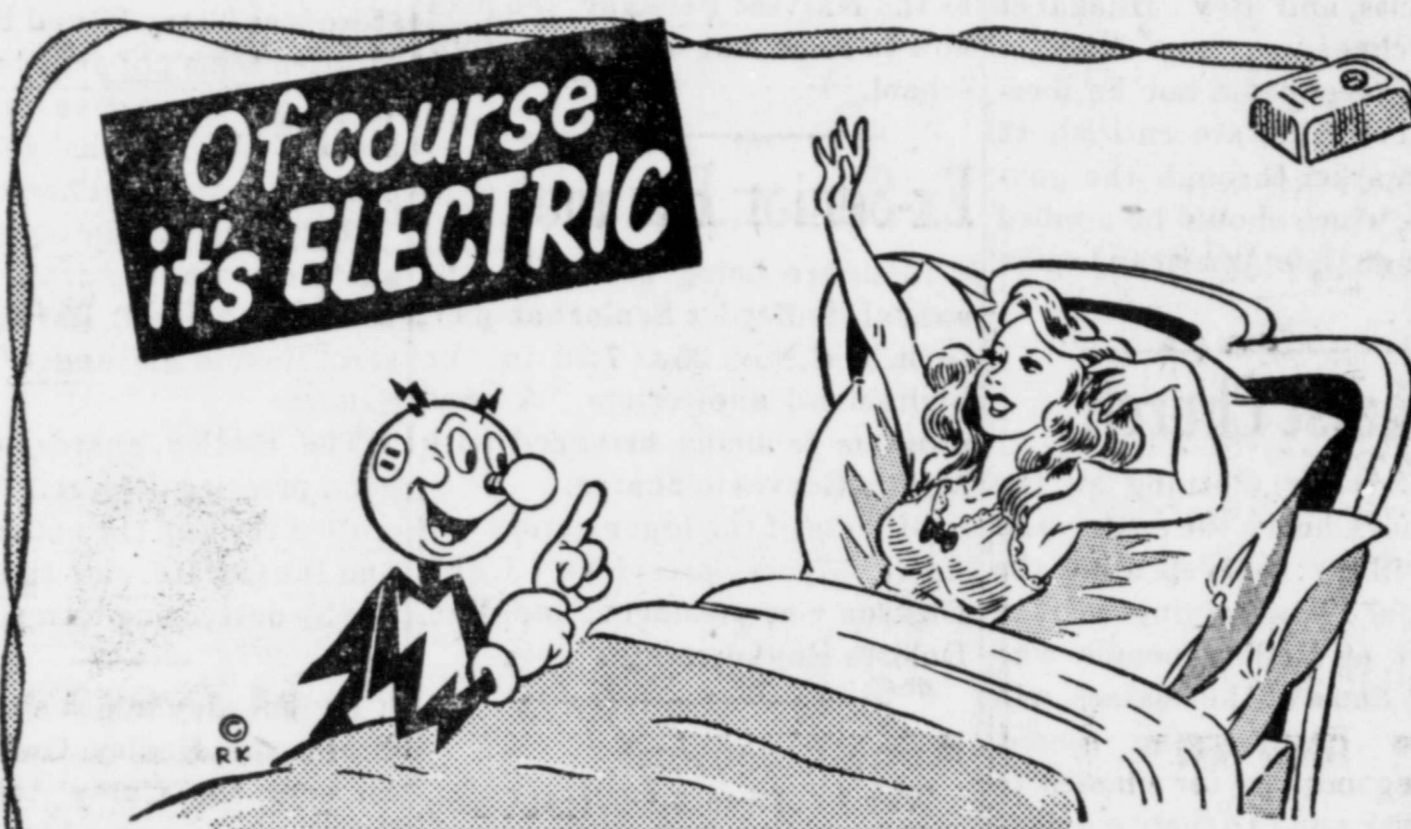

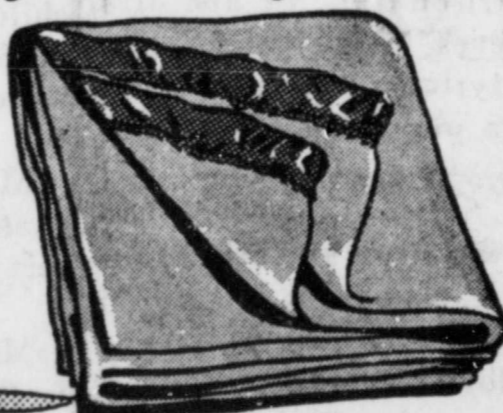

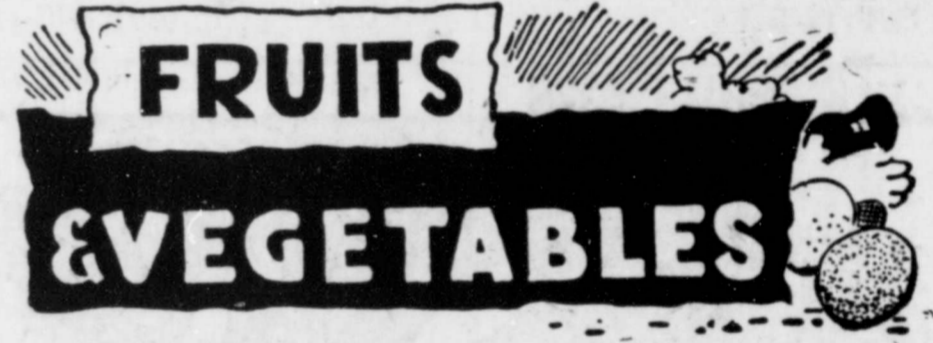
