## Attend Dam Meeting

Mayor C. H. Reid and Councilmen Robert Bailey, Sam Sanders, Ansil Adamson, and O'Neill Weatherly attended a meeting in Childress last week and heard an explanation of the proposed Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority and of plans to construct a dam across the Salt Fork of Red River near Hedley.

Towns represented were Childress, Hedley, Clarendon, Shamrock, Wellington, Quanah and Memphis.

It was voted during the meeting that each group would study the proposition thoroughly and return for another meeting in January to learn whether a confirmation election to organize the district will be possible. It was explained that, if a confirmation election is held and passes, it then becomes necessary for each town involved to vote again for a bond issue to build the project, which has been estimated at a cost of \$7 million.

## Hedley Tournament

The Clarendon boys and Memphis girls carried home the first place trophies in Hedley's invitational basketball tournament last week end. Hedley boys won 2nd place and Memphis boys 3rd. James O. (Hodge) Adamson was born at Weston, Collin Co. Texas, on April 12, 1875 and died at Lubbock, Texas, on Dec. 12, 1955.

After services conducted at the Methodist Church here Tuesday by Rev. R. N. Huckabee, he was buried in Rowe Cemetery.

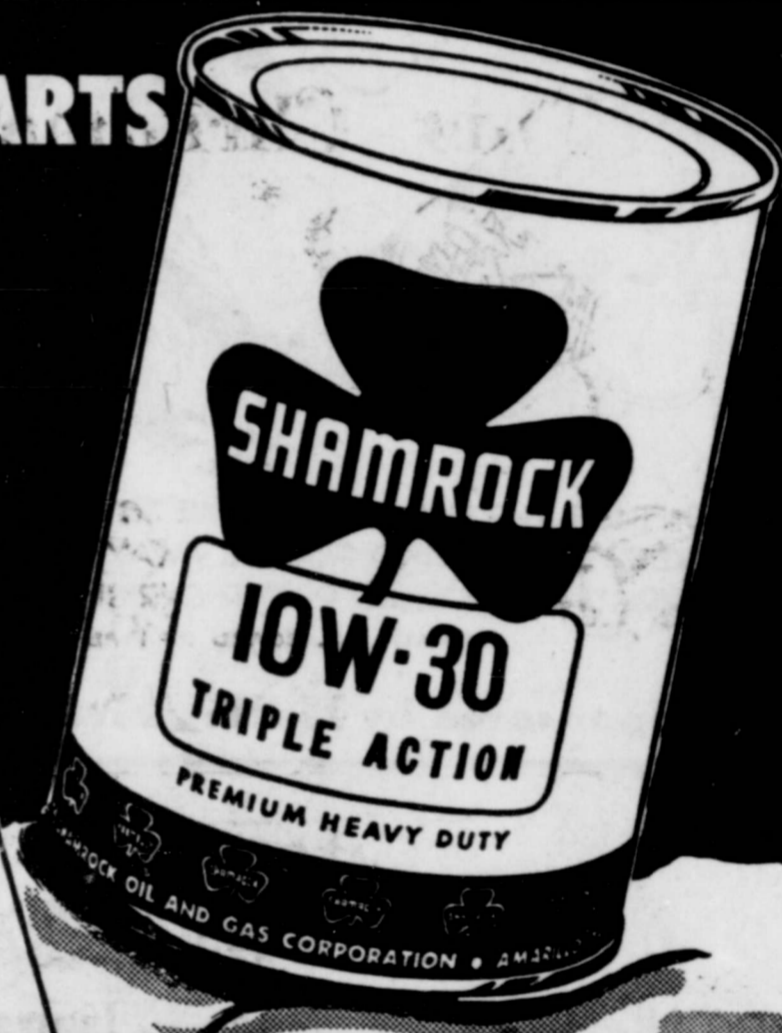

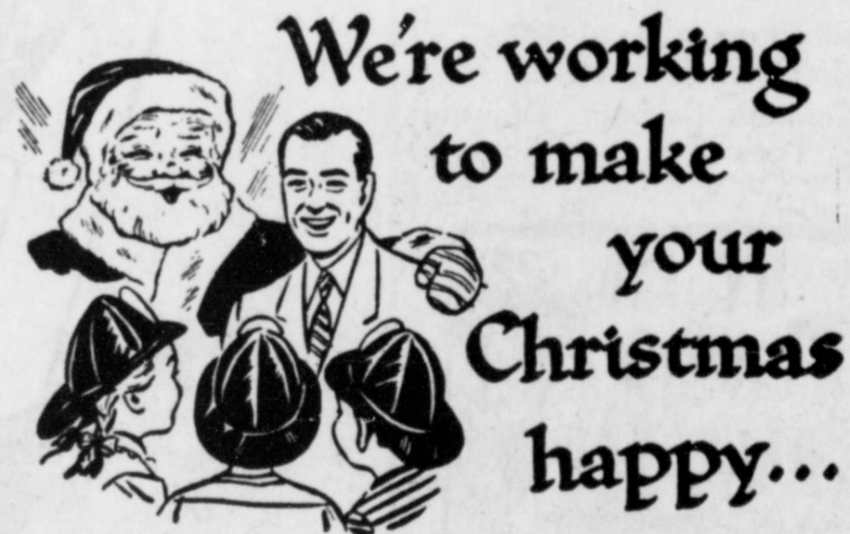
