Noel Wayne Jones, 18, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joe J. Jones of Hedley, died last Wednesday in Sonora of injuries received in a motorcycle accident earlier in the week. Noel and a companion of Sonora, who was killed instantly, were riding on a motorcycle which went out of control on a highway near Sonora Monday. His companion was Eugene Pearl, 16 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Lee Pearl of Sonora.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon in the Spicer Funeral Chapel in Memphis. Rev. J. S. Tipton, pastor of the Hedley Baptist Church, officiated. Burial was in Fairview Cemetery at Memphis.

Noel Wayne was born April 13, 1937, at Clarksville, Tex. At the time of his death he was working with a seismograph crew near Sonora.

Survivors, besides his parents, include five brothers, Buck and Boyd Jones of Hedley, W. S. Jones of Terrell, Paul P. Jones of Aspermont, and Jerry Jones of Sonora; four sisters, Mrs. Joe D. 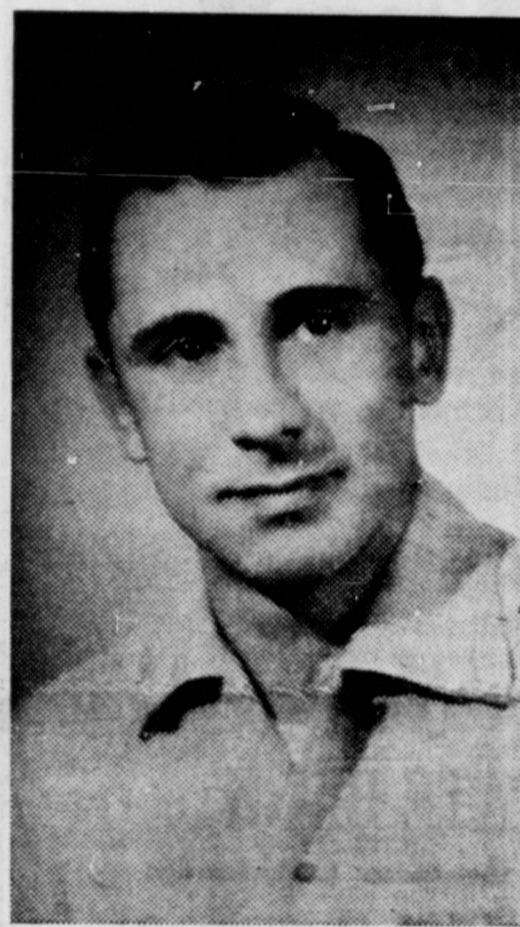

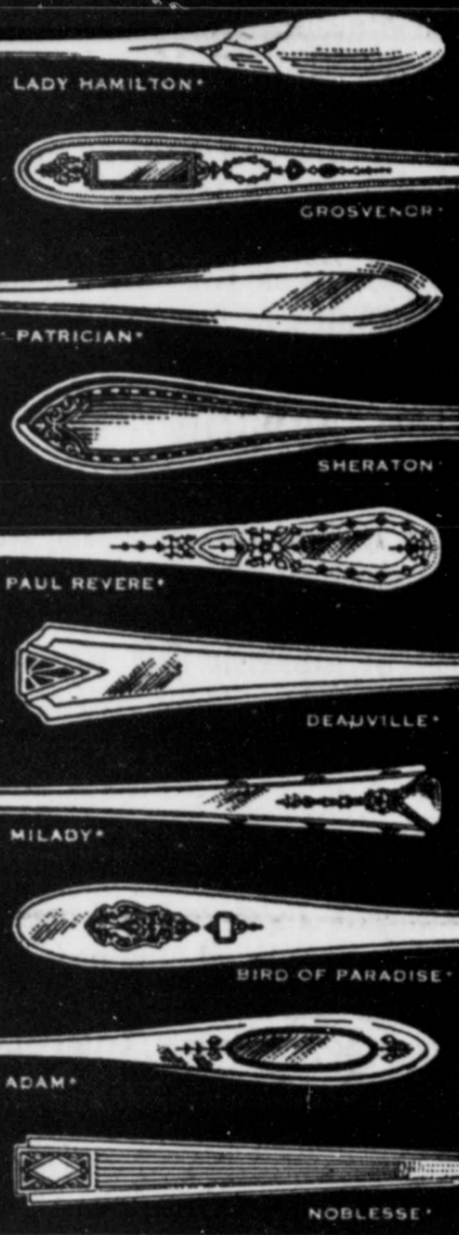
