The Hedley FFA Chapter is sponsoring a volley ball tournament April 30, May 1 and 2nd.

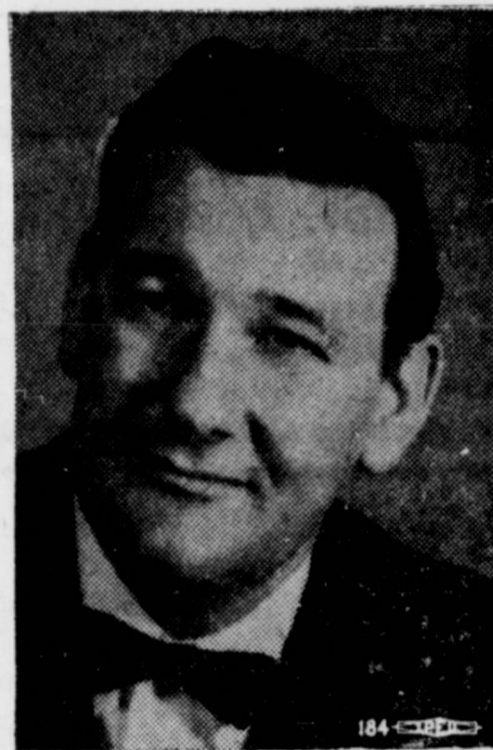
This is an invitation tournament to be held in the school gym. Several towns will be represented, and both ladies' and men's teams will be entered.
