## Soil Conservation News Queen Contest

The week of May 6 to 12 is Soil Conservation District Week in Texas. It begins on Soil Stewardship Sunday, May 6, when many churches will hold special services to recall man's duty to the land. During the rest of the week, most SCDs will present special tours, programs and field days to publicize district accomplishments and objectives.

Texas has 172 soil conservation districts which embrace 96 percent of the land area of the state. Each soil conservation district was organized only after landowners of the area voted to have such a district. SCDs are legal sub-divisions of state government, comparable to counties and school districts, but they have no taxing power. Each is governed by a board of five supervisors who must be landowners themselves, and who are elected by farmers and ranchers of the districts.

Each district helps its cooperating farmers and ranchers plan and apply conservation measures on their land. Following a master plan which was carefully prepared by farmer and rancher committees, each district works toward the goal of complete conservation for all the land in the disture teachers.




