The reason: new treatments and new medicines developed by the medical profession and the pharmaceutical industry.

But most important, these new drugs are saving children's lives-by the millions. Once, the four most deadly child-killers were diphtheria, whooping cough, scarlet fever and pneumonia. Nowadays, the number of deaths from all of these causes combined is actually less than the number of children killed by accidents.
