## Boy Scout News

The Boy Scouts of Troop No. 36 are making plans to spend June 10 to 16 at Camp Ki-O-Wah near Canadian, Scoutmaster Boaz Stotts said Monday. The boys are scheduled to leave here on Sunday morning, June 10, at 10 a. m. and arrive in Canadian about 1 p. m.

After eating lunch, the Scouts will go on to the camp by way of Glazier, due to the road from Canadian being closed for paving. # First Giles Picnic in 40 Years Is Big Success

A crowd of about 250 people gathered Wednesday under the big cottonwood trees on the banks of Buck Creek for the first Giles Picnic in 40 years. It was also the 50th anniversary of the big Giles picnic held in 1906 when the Fort Worth and Denver Railroad ran a special train from Childress to bring the Childress ball team and other celebrants.

Among the 158 old-timers who signed the register were 18 who attended the 1906 picnic and 6 who attended the first one in 1890. Two were present who rode the train in 1906, and one who played in both ends of the doubleheader ball game.

The train riders were Grose Close of Childress and Mrs. C. S. Stout of Memphis who was wearing the same black silk hose she wore 50 years ago. Charlie Shaw was the ex-ball player. He played centerfield when Giles downed Childress 3 to 1 then pitched the Giles team to a 4 to 1 victory over Clarendon. Now 80, Shaw said, "I sure couldn't do it today, but it was fun that day. Didn't even

get tired."

Mrs. A. E. Cline, 83, who has lived in Giles since 1900, was the oldest woman there and received a corsage. The oldest man was Mitchell E. Bell of Clarendon, 92. He came to Giles in 1892 and received a cane to commemorate the event.

Bell missed the oldest resident honor by moving to Clarendon. That went to C. A. Crow, 81, who came later that year to work for the Diamond Tails Ranch, and J. P. Bain, 80, who homesteaded at the mouth of Whitefish Creek on the Salt Fork.

Mrs. Malcolm Glass, daughter of the late E. H. Watt who came to Giles in 1895, could remember the first organ purchased in the community. "The ladies around here gave box suppers until they had enough to buy the organ," she said. "Then because my father was section foreman, mother and Mrs. Mary Willingham, wife of the FW&D station agent, were chosen to talk railroad officials into deadheading the organ up here for us. It was a great event the day it arrived. We all gather-

ed at the schoolhouse, had Sunday school, then spent the rest of the day listening to folks play while we sang and sang. It didn't take as much to satisfy us then as it does now," she mused.

Although string bands and old fiddlers entertained throughout the day, the formal program was brief. Billy Lowe of Clarendon offered the invocation. Malcolm Glass was song leader. J. Claude Wells, publisher of the Memphis Democrat, gave the welcome, and John McMicken of Memphis responded. Bob Ayers of Memphis was master of ceremonies.

Folks had such a good time they decided to form a permanent organization and to make it an annual event. Mrs. Virginia Rogers was elected president and Mr. and Mrs. Lowell Houston vice president and secretary.

Carter Willingham of Ft. Worth who lived in Giles from 1890 to 1906 brought a picture to the picnic of the Giles school children taken in 1896. Mr. Willingham brought a carload of former residents who now live in Tarrant County.

Others who travelled a long distance to renew acquaintances included Jake and Sylvia Thaxton of Los Angeles, Claude Thaxton of Denver, Mr. and Mrs. N. A. Pritchett of Paris, Dianne Geter of Dallas, and Emmagene DeSan-

tis of Leesburg, Fla.

Among the many people who helped to make the day a success were Frank Murray who graded the roads and levelled the baseball diamond, Mrs. Cordia Levi who furnished the coffee, J. C. Waddell and Richard Stotts who were in charge of the music, and J. W. Coppedge of Memphis, who ran electric lines to the site which was provided by Lowell Houston.

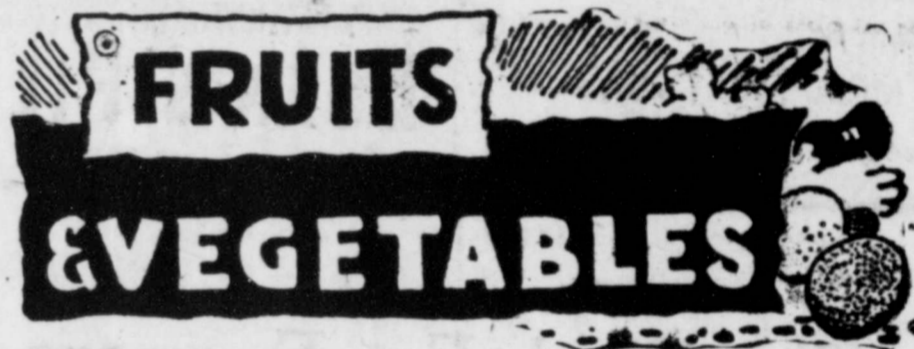
