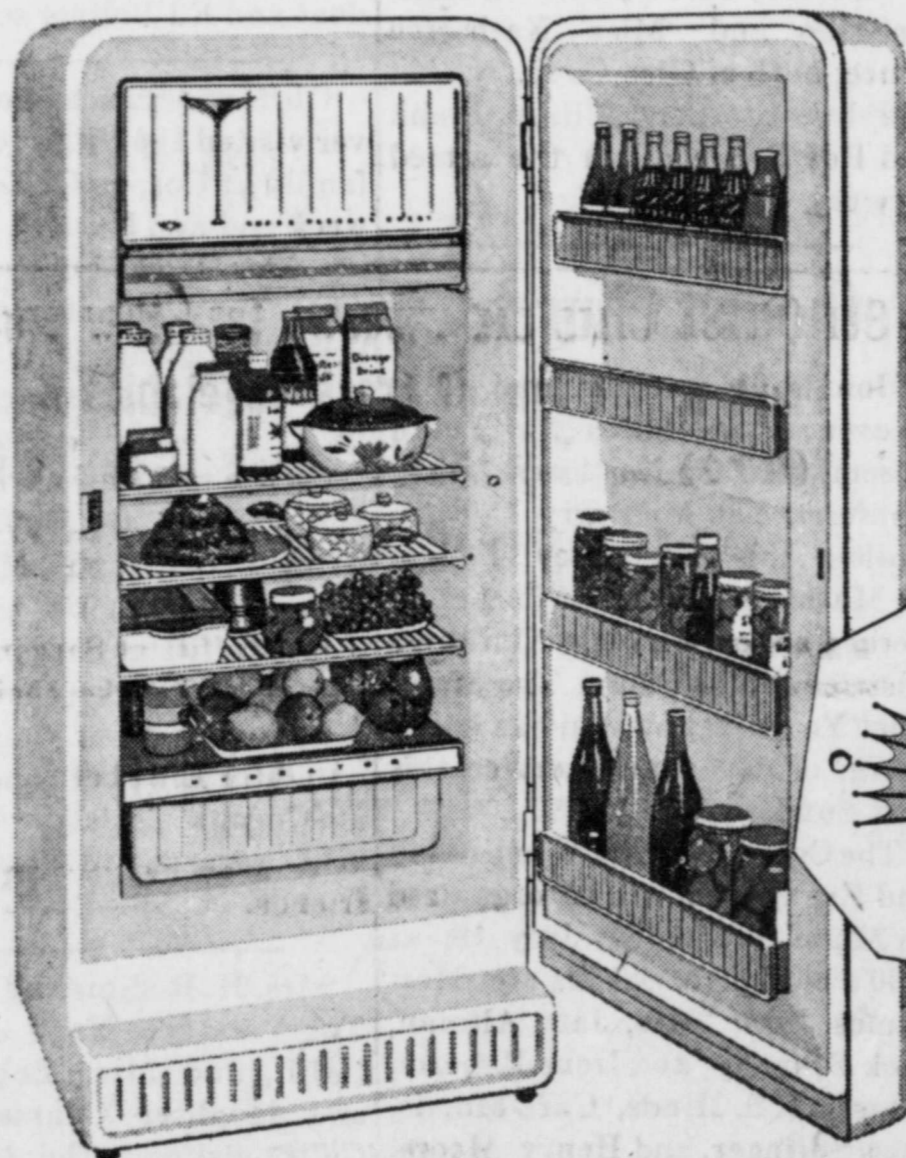

the present time sideoats seed is selling for 75¢ to \$1 per pound. It is possible that some pastures would make 50 to 100 pounds of seed per acre. Besides the native grass pastures, areas that have been reseeded to grass may offer excellent opportunity for seed harvest. Sandlove grass, Indian grass switch grass, and weeping lovegrass are among the most likely possibilities here.

It is realized that grass seed harvest is new to most farmers and ranchers, and for that reason a chance to make a nice profit could easily be passed up. Technicians of the Soil Conservation Service, assisting the Donley Soil Conservation District will assist district cooperators in planning and carrying out a seed harvest.



False rumors to the effect that I was against the Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority is ridiculous. I introduced and passed House Bill 88 which created the above water authority.

I was opposed to the administration's water bill which called for an ad valorem tax on all our farms and ranches, business property etc., to build dams in other parts of the state. I was opposed to the administration's two cent gas tax because the counties were not permitted to share in a small part to buy right-of-ways.

I was one of only three members of the House voting against the Constitutional Amendment which calls for another election one week after the General Election this fall at the taxpayers expense. Several hundred thousand dollars will be spent on this election alone.
