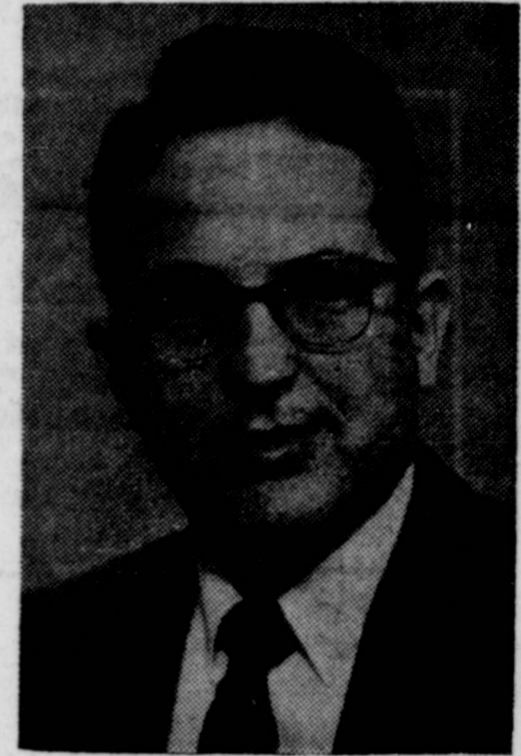
Twenty-seven food specialists from seven states conducted more than 80 sessions on new developments in food preparation, meal service, food buying, meal planning and related subjects.

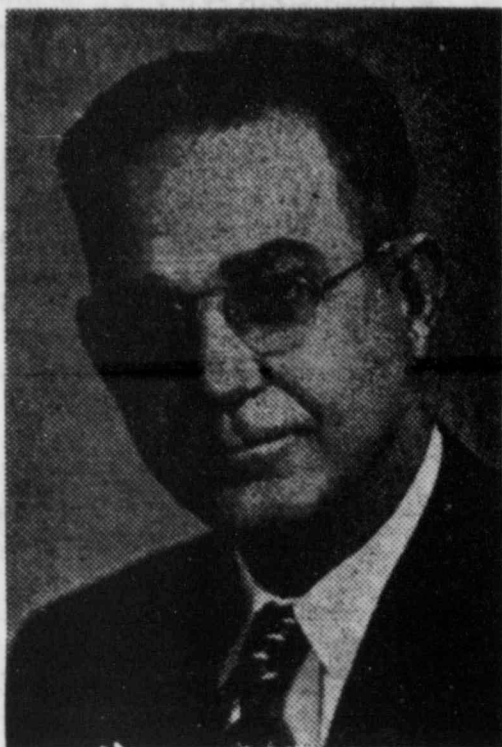

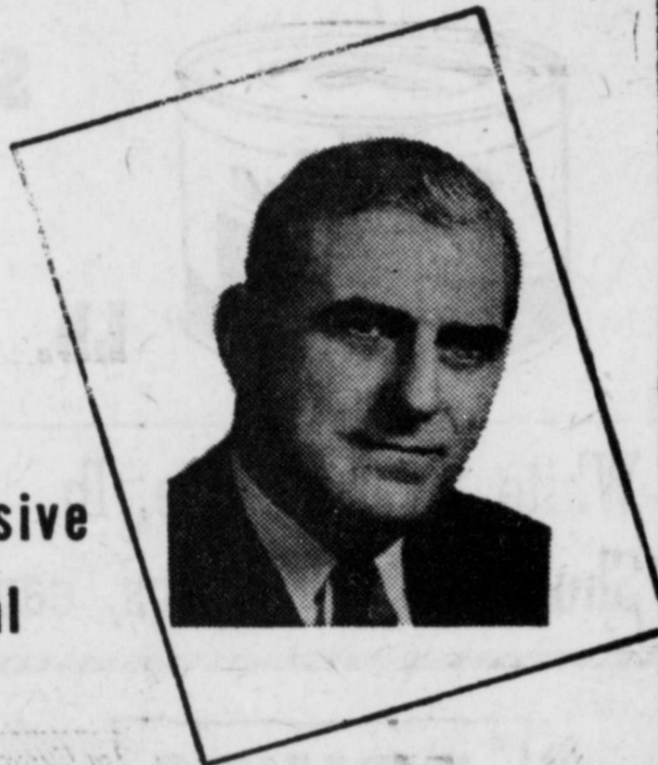
