## News From Our County Agent

Troy Harrison, Donley County 4-H Club boy will attend a week long range management school at Junction, Texas, August 13 to 18. H. M. Breedlove, county agent and in charge of 4-H Club work in the county, says that Troy is being sent by the Donley County Soil Conservation District. To be eligible to go to this school a boy must live on a ranch and be active in club work.

The American Society of Range Management and the Forestry department with headquarters at College Station, is sponsoring the school for youth of the state. Specialists in different phases of range management from the Extension Service and the SCS will appear on the program in the different classes. This is a wonderful opportunity for Troy who will learn a great deal about the management of ranges and the handling of cattle. ## School Regains Full Accreditation

Supt. J. S. Hinds met with the State Accreditation Committee in Austin July 23rd and the following recommendations were made pertaining to the Hedley School:

"In view of the continued improvement being made in most aspects of the school program, and particularly because of the removal of most of the deficiencies referred to in last year's report, it is recommended that the Hedley Independent School District be removed from the advised list and be given full accreditation. It is urged however, that school improvement become a continuous project and that the suggestions of the visiting team be carefully studied and complied with wherever possible and practicable.

The school board and Superintendent of Hedley Schools are to be commended for the improvements made in the school in bringing it up to Accreditation standards."

## Community Mourns As Mr. and Mrs. Leon Reeves Die In Collision

One of the greatest tragedies ever to strike our community stunned Hedley people late Sunday night when the sad news came that Mr. and Mrs. Leon Reeves had been killed in a head-on collision just west of Clarendon on highway 287.

Their son, Buddy, remains in critical condition in an Amarillo hospital. The other passenger in the car, Sharon Harrison of Memphis, was released Monday night after being held in the hospital for observation.

The Reeves' had been to Amarillo to visit their son, Don, who had been undergoing treatment in a hospital there.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon from the First Methodist Church here by Rev. A. B. Cockrell of Perryton. He was assisted by Rev. Melvin R. Mathis, pastor of the First Methodist Church here, and Rev. J. S. Tipton, pastor of the First Baptist Church.

Leon Reeves was born July 29, 1907, in Hedley, and Mrs. Reeves, the former Alice Noel, was born Dec. 18, 1908, in Memphis. They are survived by one daughter, Mrs. Carolyn Jones of Plainview, three sons, Don, Bill, and Buddy Reeves, all of Hedley, and one grandson, Richy Jones. Leon is also survived by his mother, Mrs. W. E. Reeves of Hedley, and two sisters, Mrs. Ina Harris of Rotan and Miss Myrtle Reeves of Hedley. Mrs. Reeves is also survived by her father and stepmother, Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Noel of Weatherford, and three sisters, Mrs. Mary Anderson of Wellington, Mrs. Gertrude Boatright of Boys Ranch, and Miss Martha Sue Noel of Roswell, N. Mex.

Both Leon and Alice were members of the Hedley Methodist Church, and both took part in so

many activities that their loss leaves a great gap in our community life. Leon was manager of the Hedley Lumber Co., was a steward and member of the finance committee in his church, a member of the Hedley school board, president of the Hedley Fire Dept., past president of the Hedley Lions Club, past president of the Hedley Booster Club and past Worshipful Master of the Hedley Masonic lodge. Alice was assistant cashier of the Security State Bank, past president of the Hedley PTA, past president of the Woman's Culture Club, a member of the Hedley Eastern Star lodge, and was very active in MYF work, and a Sunday School teacher. Both will be sorely missed in every part of our community.

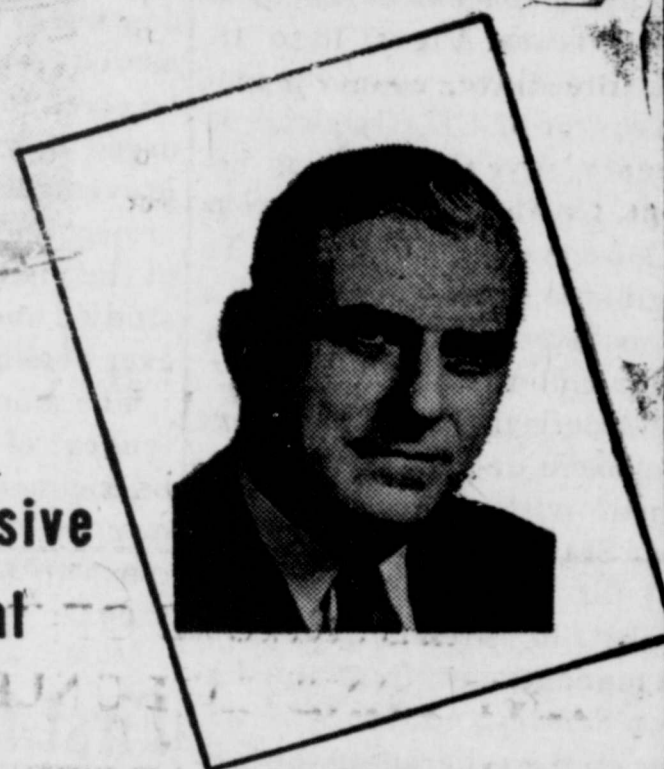

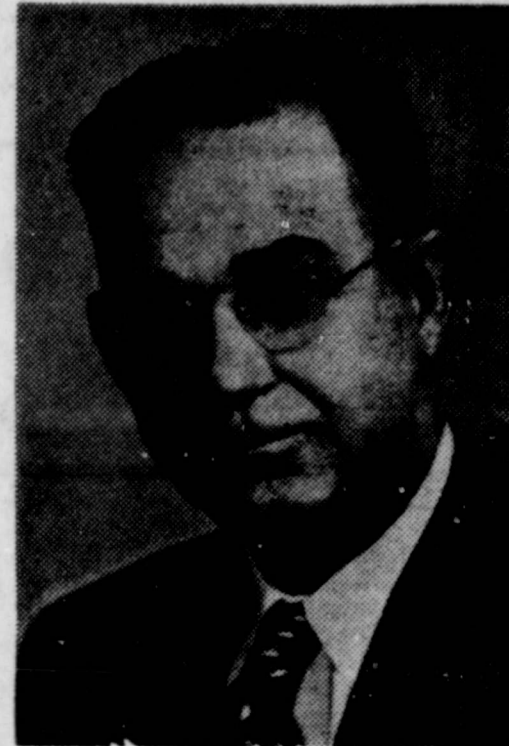

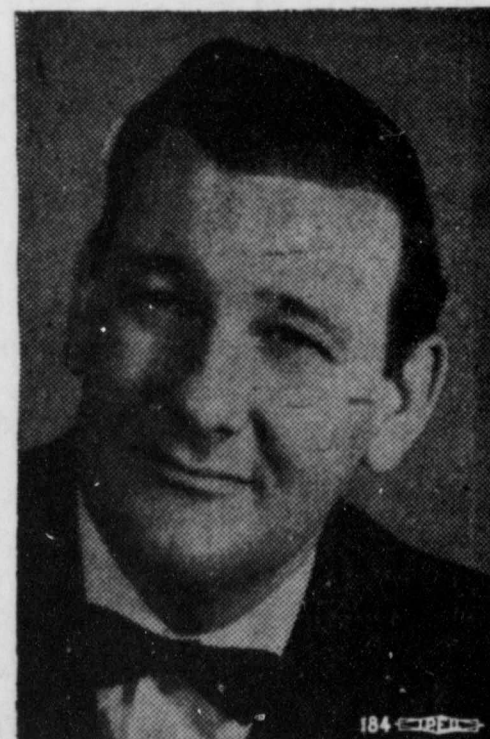

## The Duty of the District Attorney

is to prosecute all felony criminal cases (those cases for which a person may be sent to the penitentiary) and to assist the peace officers and grand juries in making investigations to determine whether or not a criminal offense has been committed.

## The Duty of the County Attorney

is to prosecute all misdemeanor criminal cases (those cases for which a person may be fined or confined in the county jail) and to assist peace officers and grand juries in making investigations to determine whether or not a criminal offense has been committed. In addition to this the County Attorney is charged with the duty of acting as legal adviser to the County Commissioners Court.

## The Duty of the Grand Jury

is to make investigations to determine whether or not there has been a violation of our criminal statutes and to further determine whether or not the facts justify an indictment. No man may be tried in Texas for a felony offense unless he is first indicted by a grand jury.

## Theft is a Felony or a Misdemeanor

according to the value of the property stolen. The theft of property of a value of \$50.00 or more is a felony. The theft of property of a value of less than \$50.00 is a misdemeanor and may be tried by the County Attorney upon a complaint without a grand jury indictment. Each theft is an offense and a number of misdemeanor thefts cannot be added together to make one felony offense.

## During the Grand Jury Investigation of Donley County Affairs

last year, the County Attorney assisted me in presenting the facts to the Grand Jury. All facts that were available to me were presented and I feel sure that the County Attorney did not withhold any facts known to him. No person other than members of the grand jury are permitted to be present in the grand jury room while the grand jury deliberates and determines whether or not an indictment shall be returned. No indictments were returned but the grand jury did issue a statement which was published in the Donley County Leader. The District Attorney does not have the authority to suggest in any manner whether or not a grand jury shall return an indictment. I have adhered strictly to this rule as any grand juror will attest who has served with me. I like the grand jury system. So long as we have it, one person cannot exert distastefulship over the reputation, life and property of any citizen. I have faith and confidence in the citizenship of Donley County from whom our grand juries are selected. I believe that the citizens of Donley County who have been selected as grand jurors in the past have acted in good faith for what they thought was the best interest of law enforcement in Donley County. I believe that those who may be selected in the future will act in the same manner. A jury commission selects the grand jurors and I have nothing to do with the selection of the jury commissions. If the county attorney finds that a theft of county property of a value less than \$50.00 has been committed surely he will not only tell the people but will prosecute the offender. Should he find that there has been a theft of \$50.00 or more, surely he will cause a complaint to be filed on the examining docket of the grand jury and assist in presenting the facts to the grand jury for their consideration.

## As Your District Attorney

I do not make the facts, I only present them. This I have done to friend and foe alike. A prosecuting attorney who would use the office to punish an enemy or to aid a friend is not only an undesirable official but an undesirable citizen. I have bowed before my Maker many times asking for the wisdom, strength

and guidance necessary to so conduct myself in prosecuting cases. Since not all people are honest it necessarily follows that some public officials may be dishonest. However, under the law a person is presumed to be innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt in a court of competent jurisdiction. Even a public official should be accorded the same consideration.

## Not Any One Person Holds a Corner on Honesty

Dishonesty raises its vile and ugly head in many forms. A person who maliciously misrepresents things and spreads erroneous rumors that reflect on the good name of another person is no more honest than a person who steals property belonging to another.

It is my sincere hope that the service rendered by me as your District Attorney will merit your vote for my re-election.


