## Soil Conservation News

This area is zone 5 of the District and was represented by J. A. Tollett.

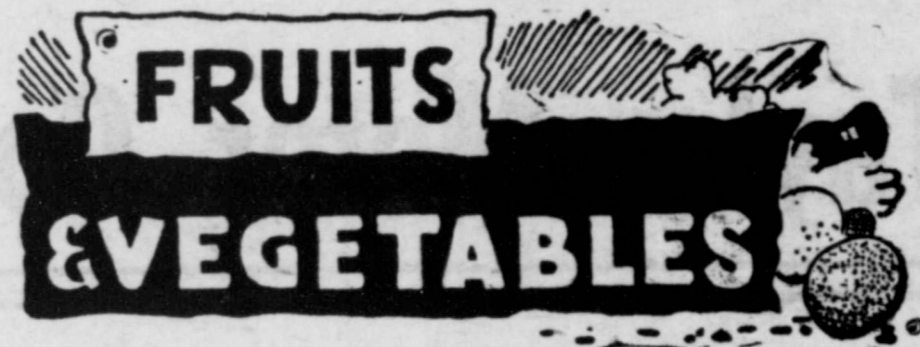
