News From Our County Agent

The Donley County Fair Board met in the office of county agent H. M. Breedlove Nov 27 and set the dates for the Donley County steer show for club boys on Dec. 28 and swine show for Jan. 18. There will be about 34 steers in the steer show. The classes will be light and heavy Herefords, light and heavy Angus, one of dry lot steers that have not been on a nurse cow at any time while owned by the feeder, also one for heifers in breeding class for club boys. Any adults who have registered stock that they would like to put on display can do so if they contact Breedlove as soon as possible so that space can be allotted them. There will also be a group of two steers fed by any club member and of course the grand champion and reserve champion steers of the

entire show. The official weigher for the show is W. H. Cooke 111, and judge of the show will be J. P. Smith, superintendent of Pantex Farms. All livestock will be in the barn at 9 a. m. so judging can start promptly at 10. The amount of premium to be paid will be published at a later date. John Gillham is in charge of F F A boys at Clarendon, Bobby Lee at Lelia Lake and Doyle Messer at Hedley; Breedlove is in charge of the 4-H Club work in the county. The show dates were set up early this year because 4-H Club boys will exhibit some steers at the Hereford show at Odessa on Jan. 1.

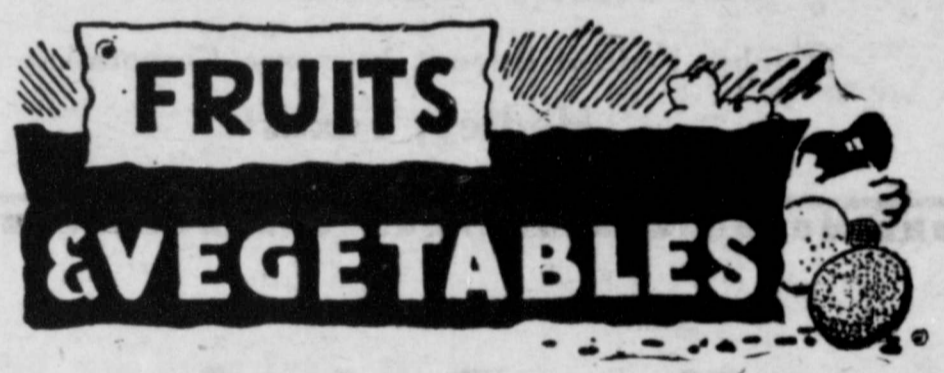
