companies flood post offices with computerized mailings notifying, people "they've won a prize,"
usually after offering for sale everything from vitamins to office
supplies. "The operators then supplow up with high-pressure telemarketing," Clauson says,
"usually asking for money or a credit card number to cover

company and call them back-
without giving out your credit card number or any money--and if still
