School attendance is important not only from an academic point of view but also a financial point of view. State funds are based on average daily attendance (ADA).
Bovina Schools receive from the state approximately $\$ 1400$ pe student in ADA. When a student is
absent this decreases our ADA
which in turn, decreases dollars. State money lost has to be made up at the local level through

Bovina Schools presently has a PK-12 enrollment of 467. A 98 per cent attendance rate during the month of October would produce
