

Texas motorists may be lined up for blocks before neighborhood automobile service centers as the April 15 deadline nears for obtaining safety inspection stickers for cars and trucks, Maj. R. A. Crowder, Commander of Region 5 of the Texas Department of Public Safety, announced today.

"Of the half-million vehicles in the Department of Public Safety's Region 5, only 125,000 have received state inspection stickers," said Captain Alan Johnson, Commander of Motor Vehicle Inspec tion Service of Region 5. "Eleven weeks remain in which to obtain 1958 stickers and there are 375,000 vehicles still to be inspected in the 60 counties of Region 5"

"Texas law requires that motorists have the safety stickers on all registered motor vehicles by midnight, April 15. In addition, all trailers registered in Texas which exceed 4000 pounds gross weight must have safety stickers," Johnson said.

Other speakers will include the Supt. of the Spur Experiment Station, the area S C S supervisor, and three specialists from A & M College.


