Greenbelt Dam News

Clifford Johnson attended the meeting of the board of directors of the Greenbelt Water Authority at Childress last Thursday night.

The entire watershed of the Salt Fork will be mapped consisting of some 400 square miles. This expense will be borne by the state.

Also daily sampling of the water of the river at the dam site will be continued until September 1st. This includes analysis of the water, high and low of the flow of the river and should give a complete picture as this will complete 2½ years of daily sampling. This expense is borne partly by the State Water Board of Engineers and partly by the seven cities of the authority.

The directors will meet again in the next 10 days with the Engineers and Attorneys of the Authority at which time the coring of the dam will be discussed, also the legal steps necessary so that no time will be lost. It could be sooner than we think.

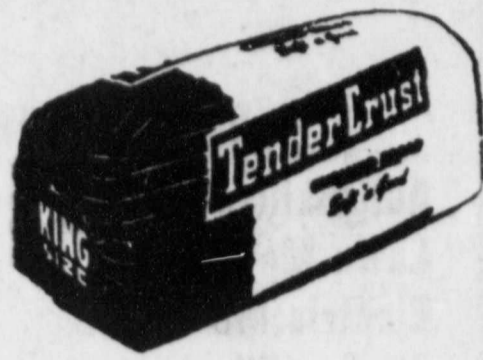
