

Fishing License

Austin, March 31 With fishing picking up on every lake and stream in Texas, many fishermen will be grabbing equipment and heading out. A license is required for all fishing except fishing in your own home county with an ordinary pole and line, trotline, or throw line with no reeling device attached. Those under 17 years of age and those over 65 years of age are exempt from all licenses unless fishing for commercial purposes.


