Rev. George C. Hutto Bank Pays Interest

Funeral services for Rev. George C. Hutto, retired Baptist minister who passed away Monday at his home in Pampa were held Wednesday from the First Baptist Church there by Rev. Douglas Carver. Burial was in a Pampa cemetery.

Bro. Hutto was 69 years of age and had been in the ministry some 47 years. He was pastor of the Hedley Baptist Church 25 or 30 years ago.

He is survived by his wife, Rachel; two daughters, Mrs. Robert Owens of Shawnee, Okla., and Mrs. Oscar Westbrook of Pampa; three sons, Truett of Lubbock, D. B. of Grand Junction, Colo., and John Allen of Oakland, Calif.; and six sisters.

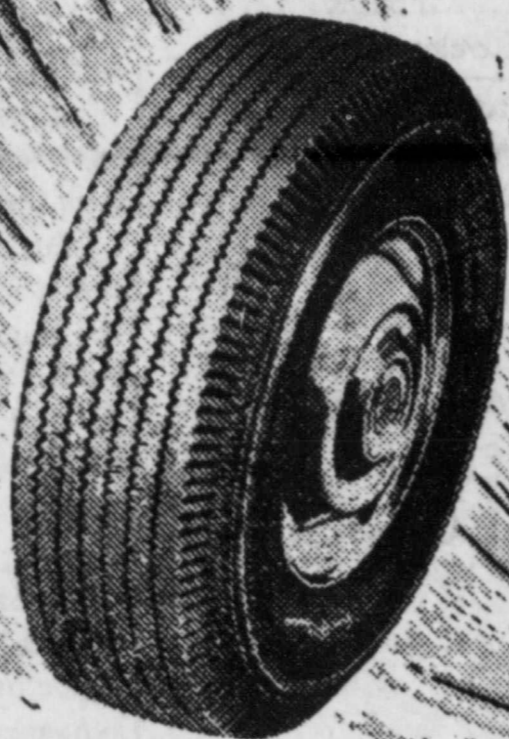

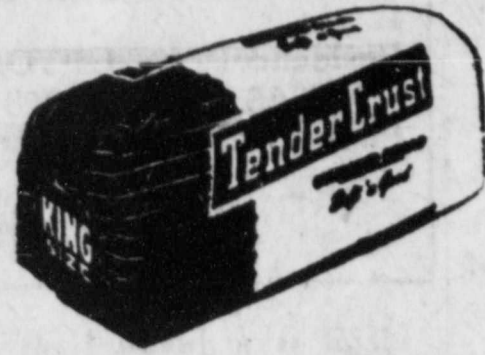
