General Telephone Co. Buys Hedley Exchange

The purchase of the Hedley Telephone Company, owned by Mr. C. E. Johnson, and the heirs of the late A. L. Johnson, was announced today by E. H. Danner, President of the General Telephone Company of the Southwest in San Angelo. General Telephone began operation of the exchange on September 1, 1958.

The Hedley Exchange will become a part of the Memphis district of the northern division of the company. The district manager for this area is Roy Brewer and the division manager is Mills Roberts. Both of these company officials' offices are in Memphis, Texas, which also is the headquarters of the 71 exchanges of the Northern division that extends from Haskell on the south, Bryson on the east, Dalhart on the west and as far north as Guymon, Oklahoma. The company operates approximately 34,766 telephones in this division.

The purchase of the Hedley property will bring the total number of exchanges operated by General Telephone Company of the Southwest to 265, throughout the five state area of Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, New Mexico and Louisiana, which it now serves, stated the company president. The company operates more than 265,000 telephones in the southwest. Notice is hereby given to whom concerned that Greenbelt Municipal And Industrial Water Authority, the postoffice address of which is Hedley, Texas, on the 11th day of August, 1958, filed its application in the office of the Board of Water Engineers for the State of Texas, in which it applies for a permit to appropriate of the unappropriated waters of the State of Texas, from the Salt Fork of the Red River in Donley County, Texas, not to exceed 30,000 acre feet of water per annum, 18,000 acre feet for municipal use and 12,000 acre feet for industrial use; capacity of proposed reservoir 100,500 acre feet, being more fully set out in said application.

Station 40-00 of the proposed dam is located at a point which bears south 1200 feet from the northwest corner of H. & G. N. R R Company, Block 21, Section No. 117, on the north bank of Salt Fork of Red River in Donley County, Texas, and is distant approximately 10 0 miles in a northerly direction from Hedley, Texas.

A hearing on the application of the said Greenbelt Municipal And Industrial Water Authority will be held by the Board of Water Engineers for the State of Texas, in the office of the Board at Austin, Texas, on Monday, October 6, 1958, beginning at two o'clock p. m., at which time and place all parties interested may appear and be heard. Those opposing the granting of said application should file written protests with the Board and the applicant at least five days prior to hearing date, giving their reasons therefor and such other information as is required by Board Rule 305.2. Such hearing will be continued from time to time, and from place to place if necessary, until such determination has been made relative to said application as the said Board of Water Engineers may deem right, equitable and proper.

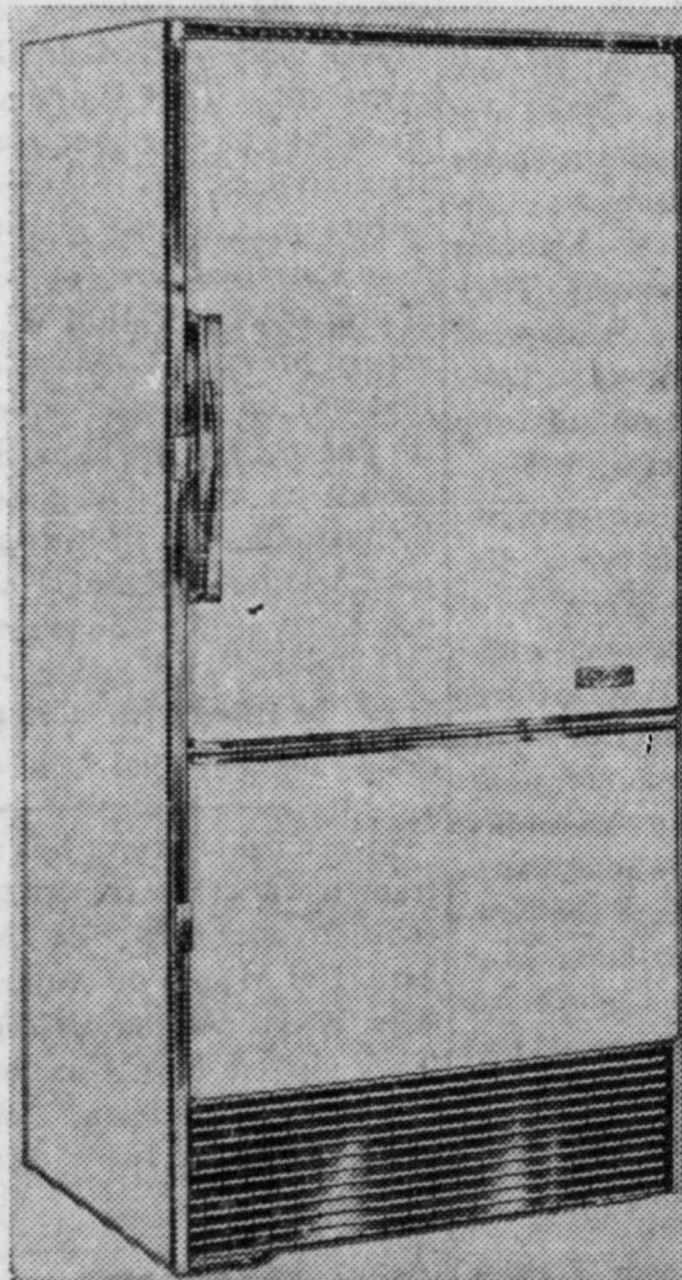
